# FROM THE PASTOR

He was only a boy of four, so there was nothing unusual about the fact that he did not like soap and water. One day his mother, endeavoring to reason with him, said, "But surely you want to be clean, don't you?" "Yes," the boy replied through his tears, "but can't you just dust me off?"

Ash Wednesday on February 14 is the beginning of Lent and is about cleansing, and we hear the words, "You are dust and to dust you shall return". Ashes bring to mind fire -- the fire of Old Testament scriptures which destroyed evil cities and made the people start new and fresh and clean again. Ashes were also one of the main ingredients in homemade soap. The word lent originally meant spring-time when new growth begins.

Our time of Lent, beginning with Ash Wednesday and lasting 40 days excluding Sundays (Sunday is always an Easter celebration), is the time to reflect on Baptism and its basis in the death and resurrection of Jesus. We spend our time of preparation for the great Easter event in reflection, in repentance, and in cleansing our hearts and minds to be ready for new life in Christ.

One way of helping us do this is during Wednesday worship services. This year once again on the five Wednesdays following Ash Wednesday we will have Morning Chapel Services and our Lenten Rotational at different Yorktown churches with a light meal at 6:00 and a worship service at 7:00. A schedule of all the Lent Services are included in this newsletter.

From the Vicar

The season of Lent is fast approaching. Lent is the primary penitential season of the church year: a time of preparation,

self-examination, and repentance as we move towards the death and resurrection of our Lord, Jesus Christ. During this time, there is a long standing Christian practice of adopting different spiritual disciplines as part of this intentional focus. Often, these are expressed as fasts or abstentions of differing varieties. I have lived in a few different places where, owing to cultural tradition, most every bar, grill, pub, church, scout troop, elks lodge, VFW, and restaurant in town all advertised some variety of fish fry during Fridays in Lent. And while fasting from meat or other foods, even one day a week, may somehow feel like a sacrifice, when it is done, as it often is, by custom and fear of the law, is it really a practice that points us towards the cross?

I think, instead, as we begin to move through a season of specific and intentional spiritual preparation, we could consider, instead of abstaining from thing, adding in practices to our daily life that would help us to focus on the approaching Passion of our Lord. For those who already have a daily devotional practice, is there a way that you can expand or add to it? For those who do not have a daily practice, could it be something that you give a try during Lent? As your schedule permits, are you able to come to church for the Prayer services on Wednesday mornings, or to our community midweek rotational service? These are not things that anyone *has* to do, but they are, among many other options, things that we can

all *try* as we seek to find way to rather than abstain from God, be more intentional to focus on Him in our everyday life. The thing that God takes away from us is Sin, and that means that we are meant to be filled up with Him completely. I hope that we will all find the ways to be more and more filled up in and by the Holy Spirit this Lenten season as we await the resurrection of our Lord.

## Words of Wellness for February 2018 from the Wesley Nurse Walking Humbly

Have you ever had the experience of hearing or reading something that, even though you have encountered it countless times before, all of a sudden speaks to you in a whole new way? I had such an experience last week as I sat in church listening to words that were written some 2,600 years ago. The reading was from the Book of Micah, a book of the

Hebrew Scriptures, that contains these words, “What does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with your God?” Micah 6:8.

Walking humbly was not something I valued or aspired to when I was young. In fact, the way I walked was just the opposite. When I was young, I felt then that I knew all of the answers, now however, I have as many questions as I have answers. This makes me think of a quote from the twentieth century monk and author Thomas Merton, “Pride makes us artificial and humility makes us real.” My youthful pride in thinking I knew it all was, in retrospect, quite artificial, and was in reality a symptom of my youthful insecurity.

Reflecting on Merton’s quote, I have come to realize that the people in my life who I know to be most real and authentic are also humble people. These are the people I admire most and want to learn from. They walk humbly, and interestingly enough, although I don’t think it is a coincidence, they are also people who love mercy and act justly, just as Micah directed us to do so many years ago.

One of my other favorite quotes about humility comes from C.S. Lewis, “Humility is not thinking less of yourself, it’s thinking of yourself less.” Humility means not needing to be the center of attention, not insisting on your own way, not needing to get recognition for a good deed done, and not needing to compare oneself to anyone else.

I recently returned from a ten day trip to the land where the prophet Micah wrote his words about the importance of acting justly, loving mercy, and walking humbly. 2,600 years after Micah wrote those words, the inhabitants of Israel and Palestine are clearly struggling to figure exactly how to live out those words, just as we in our country are as well. That, in itself, is cause for great humility, as each of us must discern in our own lives just exactly what it means to act justly, and love mercy, as we walk humbly with our God.

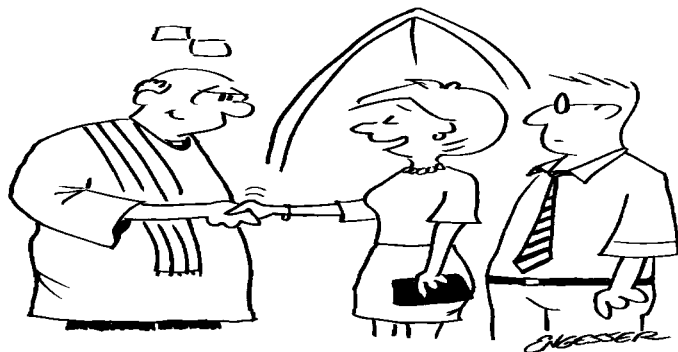
