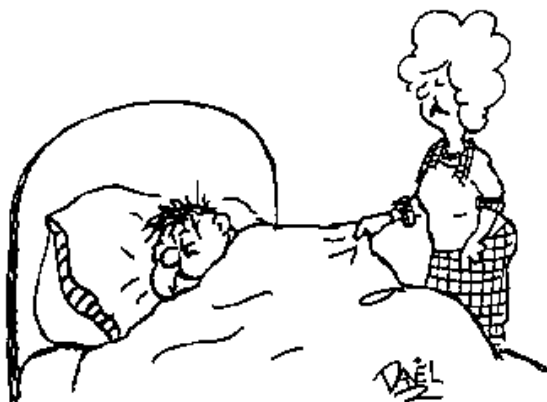

CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES

June 14, 2018

President, Bill Klaevemann, called the meeting of St. Paul Church Council to order. Present for the meeting were Pastor Tim Muehlbrad, Nicholas Requejo, Bill Klaevemann, Beverly Bruns, Calvin Bruns, Kimberly Gaus, Jay Heil, Ray Lange, Cathy Moritz, Dorothy Mayfield, and Judy Taylor. Visitors Luellen Smiley, Clara, and Jeff Stewart were also in attendance.

Bill Klaevemann gave the devotion.

With no additions or corrections the minutes of May 10, 2018 stand approved as presented.

REPORTS

A. Treasurer - Calvin reported the income over expenses in the operating account is \$4,100 and the balance in the building account is \$8,400. The accounts which have been combined will show up in the end of June statement. With the help of Loris Maddox, some of the Money Market Accounts have been combined, the changes will be evident next month. With no questions or corrections the treasurer's report was accepted as presented.

B. Stewardship - Calvin will be putting articles concerning stewardship in the bulletins and newsletters.

C. Youth - No report.

D. Worship – With questions from a member, Jay made a motion to include the suggestion of having Communion every Sunday in our Special Congregational meeting on July 8th. Ray seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Pastor Ron Walter will fill in for Pastor Muehlbrad on Sundays when he is on vacation. The Pastors from Meyersville and Goliad will fill in, as needed, during the week.

E. Social Concerns - Judy reported that one family was assisted with rent.

F. Property - Ray stated that the lights in the attic have been replaced, the fence around the air conditioners has been replaced, the building behind parsonage 2 is being rebuilt as well as the fence around the air conditioner, steps on back porch of parsonage 1 are rebuilt, vents under educational building were closed, sod was placed in front of educational building, grass at cemetery was mowed, replaced 2 fans in the daycare, ordered 6 more to use as replacements, benches replaced at awning, bathrooms in daycare have been closed up on top, and water bills corrected. Ray also ordered sensors for basement which detect cold or water issues.

G. Parish Education - Story Boards are being used to teach the lessons.

H. C. E. M. - see attached report

I. Evangelism/Outreach - On Mother's Day key chain flashlights were handed out to all the ladies. On Father's Day, men will receive a gift.

J. Christian Life - On May 20th Christian Life hosted a chicken spaghetti congregational meal for Pentecost. The graduating seniors were also honored at that time with a cake.

Approximately 90 people attended. On July 29th a sandwich/chip meal with a homemade ice cream sundae bar will be held. On August 19th, a Bunco party will be enjoyed.

K. Cemetery - We will be seeking legal advice on how to proceed with this issue.

L. Nicholas - Nicholas has finished the Youth Policy, taught two chapels for the Learning Garden, and took the youth to Laser World. He will continue with the summer schedule. Nicholas requested 3 days off to attend a friend's wedding in Illinois. The council agreed to the days.

M. Pastor Muehlbrad - Professional activities during May 2018 include: 8 Worship Serviced, 4 Hospital visits, 10 Home Visits, 9 Education Events, 6 Church Meetings and Events, 1 Professional Meeting/Event, and 1 Community event.

Official Acts: On 5/12 the Baptism of Clinton Edward Harmon, Wyatt John Harmon, Wyston Warren Harmon, Wryder Lee Harmon, and on 5/13 the Baptism of Charles Roy Cook IV.

Pastor Tim also noted that, for now, we only have one lay delegate attending the Convocation in August and we can have 3 more attend.

OLD BUSINESS

A. RED CROSS PRESENTATION

Jeff Stewart and Clara gave a presentation on what is involved in opening a facility for individuals during a disaster. The Red Cross representative for our area that we should contact is Debbie Ellsworth. Their suggestion is to set up a Shelter Team and have people in the community helping people in the community. St. Paul's participation role will be discussed at the next meeting.

B. Discuss replacement of cushions in sanctuary, set a Special Congregational Meeting and carpet removal.

Luellen Smiley, representing the Task Force of Luellen, Doris Koehler, Pam Hoefling, and Beth Sievers, stated that the present cushions are deteriorating on the inside, causing dust under the cushions and on members clothes. Sam Saunders with Waggoners, Inc. gave a bid of \$16,975 for new cushions in the Church, including the annex, and communion rail cushions. There will be no charge for the clergy cushion, the kneeling rail cushion, as well as no charge for disposing of the old cushions. Ray made a motion to take the bid to the congregation at a Special Congregational Meeting. Dorothy seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Beverly made a motion to have the carpet in the Chancel area be removed so the congregation will be able to evaluate the condition of the wood under the carpet. Judy seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Ray made a motion to have a Special Congregational Meeting on July 8th. Kimberly seconded the motion. The motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS

A. APPROVE ALTER GUILD POLICY

Ray made a motion to accept the Alter Guild policy. Beverly seconded the motion. The motion carried.

B. Approve obtaining Credit Card for St. Paul

Because many vendors require purchases by credit cards and do not allow businesses or churches to set up credit accounts, our church is unable to purchase certain items that are less expensive. In order to save money and get the best deals, Ray made a motion to apply for a VISA credit card for our Church. Jay seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Jay made a motion for Bill Klaevemann to be the guarantor. Cathy seconded the motion. The motion carried.

C. Approve Supply Pastor for October 6 event

Jay made a motion to accept a donation for a supply pastor for October 6th and 7th to allow Pastor Tim to participate in another church member event. Ray seconded the motion. The motion carried.

D. Floor Tile in Learning Garden Problem

The issue is tabled pending additional information.

E. HELP FOR A CONGREGATIONAL MEMBER FROM BENEVOLENT RELIEF FUND

Ray made a motion to help a congregational member with some medical expenses by using some of the money from the Benevolence relief fund. Jay seconded the motion. The motion carried.

F. ADJOURNMENT

Ray made a motion to adjourn. Jay seconded the motion. The motion carried.

The meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Words of Wellness for July 2018

There is Power in Love to Show Us
the Way to Live

We know that if we are sick with a cold or the flu that what we have may be contagious. I have used this as a metaphor before when I have written about how we can also be contagious concerning our moods

and energy, spreading them to those around us. I think most of us would agree that negative moods and critical energy are contagious, sometimes infecting a whole family, group, or organization. The good news though is that joy, along with the enthusiasm of love are also contagious, and likewise, we can feel it when love and joy have infected those around us.

I don't know about you, but I don't need more reminders that negative news is contagious, as I am bombarded with evidence of this every day. What I do need are reminders that love and joy are also infectious. And that is precisely what I received this past week when someone shared with me some of the highlights of the royal wedding.

In the ceremony, including the readings and the music, it was stated:
There is something right about it (love). And there's a reason for it. The reason has to do with the source. We were made by a power of love, and our lives were meant - and are meant - to be lived in that love. That's why we are here.

There's power in love to help and heal when nothing else can. There's power in love to lift up and liberate when nothing else will. There's power in love to show us the way to live.

Think and imagine a world where love is the way.

Imagine our homes and families where love is the way. Imagine neighborhoods and communities where love is the way.

Imagine governments and nations where love is the way. Imagine business and commerce where this love is the way.

Imagine this tired old world where love is the way. When love is the way - unselfish, sacrificial, redemptive.

When love is the way, there's plenty good room - plenty good room - for

all of God's children.

When love is the way, we know that God is the source of us all, and we are brothers and sisters, children of God.

As powerful as these words are, it is the spirit with which he delivered and embodied these words-a spirit of love and joy-that the world has found to be so highly contagious. Some two billion people watched the sermon while viewing the wedding ceremony, and since then there have been millions of views of it on social media.

Frog Street Curriculum:

We are so excited that we will be teaching Frog Street Curriculum in the Fall in our Preschool and Prekindergarten Classrooms. If all goes as planned all our classrooms will soon be teaching Frog Street as well. The Texas Workforce Commission is working on a grant. Here is some information about Frog Street Pre-K.

Frog Street Pre-K (FSPK) is a high quality, research-based curriculum organized into ten skills domains that support integration of curriculum and builds connections between and among all disciplines.

Highlights include innovations to produce measurable gains in student achievement:

- The authorship team of FSPK brings a wealth of expertise in the field of early childhood classroom experience, social and emotional intelligence, brain development, literacy, second language learning, STEM practices and cultural sensitivity to the instruction and materials in the curriculum. Led by senior author, Dr. Pam Schiller, the curriculum integrates content and embeds current research based best practices through instructional strategies.
- Another innovation is the inclusion of Conscious Discipline® strategies to support social and emotional intelligence and, in turn, cognitive performance. FSPK is the sole curriculum integrating this proven program into the daily instruction.
- Differentiated learning strategies and materials for a full range of learners include grouping strategies and scaffolding. Dr. Patricia Edwards, author and past IRA President, contributed research-based best practices on family involvement in the curriculum. Family Connections resources are available for print or online.
- Innovative approaches in FSPK incorporate current research-based instruction for literacy included in the National Early Literacy Panel and Beyond, 2013. In addition, the instructional models in FSPK target strategies to ensure long term memory, alertness, and information processing based on brain science research. FSPK also incorporates STEM education, an approach to teaching and learning that integrates the content and skills of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics.
- FSPK provides innovative technology for students with Frog Street Pre-K Interactive Software which

contains over 100 Spanish and English activities in phonological awareness, alphabet knowledge, written expression, listening comprehension, vocabulary development and math skills and concepts. Software activities align with weekly instruction for sustained practice of skills. Learning extends to the home with eBooks of all the literature titles in FSPK.

- Innovative technology for teachers offers online resources which include interactive lesson planning, teacher guides and eBooks. The FSPK Digital Online Library guides instruction and is easily accessible from computers, tablets, and smartphones.

CDA Trainings:

- **An opportunity came, and I jumped on it. I received an Email from TXAEYC (Texas Association for the Education of Young Children) that they were partnering with Frog street (Curriculum) and CCEI Fame (Training) to offer scholarships for free training for teachers to receive their CDA. I registered those that could participate at this time and they all were granted the scholarship, so we pay nothing for the training. However, after they finish the 6-month training they will be responsible for the test which costs \$425. We are going to look into another scholarship for this if they will qualify.**

- **CDA stands for Child Development Associate** and the person earning a **CDA** is better prepared to meet the specific needs of **children**, and, with parents and other adults, works to nurture **children's** physical, social, emotional, and intellectual growth in the **child** development framework.
