Here comes Advent! And thus begins the church's annual battle with the secular 'sale-abration'!

Advent (from the Latin word for 'coming') originally emphasized the final coming and judgment of Christ and thus asked worshippers to focus on repentance. The emphasis changed in the 6th century to preparation. Today, we make these four weeks before Christmas both a time of repentance and preparation -- a kind of 'winter Lent'.

In many ways, Christians have always gone against the world's current, and so we are called to do the same in our time. A couple of ways you might refocus the 'sale-abration' mentality in your own life:

(1) Focus your time on the daily Advent devotionals and the gift of Immanuel as you make preparations in your own home rather than on 'x-shopping-days-to- Christmas.

(2) Rather than tell stories about Santa Claus, tell about the real St. Nicholas, bishop of Myra in the fourth century. Few facts about him are known, but legend says he aided the poor and once saved three daughters from a life on the streets by putting three purses through the window of their home for their dowries. Because he was kind to many and assisted them with gifts, he was impersonated in later years by a man with a white beard and in the red vestments of a bishop who was kind to children.

Advent is a time to receive again Christ into our lives. May it be that kind of time for you! (article adapted from Pastor Casey Zesch)

CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING ST. PAUL LUTHERAN CHURCH November 12, 2024- 6 PM

- 1. CALL TO ORDER- The meeting of the Church Council of St. Paul Lutheran Church was called to order by Boyd Wiese, President. Council members present for the meeting were Boyd Weise, Calvin Bruns, Larry Gohmert, Laurey Garica, Jay Heil, Jill Turner, Pam Hoefling, Ashleigh Peyton, and Pastor Tim Muehlbrad. Bill Klaevemann, Katie Serrano, and Terry Carmichael were also in attendance.
- 2. **DEVOTION-** Wade Bolting provided the devotion.
- 3. **MINUTES-** Pam Hoefling made a motion to accept the October 8, 2024, minutes as presented. Ashleigh Peyton seconded the motion. The motion carried.
- 4. REPORTS
 - a. **Treasurer/Stewardship-** Calvin Bruns provided a written report.
 - b. **Parish Education-** Jill Turner provided:
 - 1. Second graders were presented with their bibles on 10/20.
 - 2. The Children's Christmas Program will start having practice. Zoe has not had a lot of high school students volunteer so far. The costume

fitting will be on Sunday, November 17, 2024, during the Sunday School hour. There will be three practice dates and times: November 23rd from 9 to 11 AM, Sunday, December 1st from 2 to 4 PM, and Saturday, December 7th from 9 to 11 AM.

- c. Youth Committee Report- Laurey Garcia reported:

5. OLD BUSINESS

6. NEW BUSINESS

a. Bill Klaevemann led a committee to determine the cost of replacing the windows in the Educational Building. 4 companies were consulted and did walkthroughs of the Educational Building with the committee. All bids received from three of the four companies were based on identical criteria from the committee. One of the companies did not offer a bid. The installation time varied a little from the companies. Window warranty was also taken into consideration by the committee with the bids. Texas-Made Windows from San Antonio bid \$90,000 with a lifetime warranty. Window World from San Antonio offered a bid of \$79,000 and did not offer a lifetime warranty. The committee is recommending Window Source from San Antonio with a bid of \$57,185, which also comes with a lifetime warranty. It will take 8-12 weeks for the windows to be ordered and then 5 to 7 days for the installation. The old windows will be taken and disposed of by the company. The church will be responsible for moving any furniture or taking down any blinds that may be in the way. A partial donation has been offered. Larry Gohmert made a motion to approve the recommendation from the committee to accept the bid of \$57,185 from Window Source to replace the windows in the Educational Building, and Laurey Garcia seconded the motion. The motion carried.

- b. Cross Trails Quarterly Benevolence- ELCA is in the process of rewriting its constitution. We are looking at different options now for camps. Jay Heil made a motion to discontinue sending our 1% Benevolence fund to Cross Trails Ministry and to use the fund at our discretion beginning the calendar year of 2025. The motion carried.
- c. Delay action on the 2025 Budge Recommendation Approval until the December Council Meeting on December 10, 2024.
- d. Reviewed Nominating Committee and Council positions.
- e. Youth Task Force- Jay Heil made a motion to allow the Youth Task Force to consult with the different contractors to obtain bids to cover the parking lot by the elevator. Jill Turner seconded the motion. The motion carried.
- f. Pastor Tim requests to take a vacation from Dec. 31st through Jan. 6th. Pam Hoefling made a motion to approve Pastor Tim's request for vacation. Laurey Garcia seconded. The motion carried.
- 7. **CLOSING-** Ashleigh Peyton made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Laurey Garcia seconded the motion. The motion carried, and the meeting closed with The Lord's Prayer.




