January 12, 2021

- 1) CALL TO ORDER The meeting of the Church Council of St. Paul Lutheran Church was called to order by Clem Waskow. Katie Serrano was also in attendance.
- 2) **DEVOTION** The devotion was given by Clem Waskow.
- 3) **MINUTES** The minutes from December 8, 2020, were approved as printed with no corrections.

#### 4) REPORTS

- a) Treasurer The balance in the General Fund as of December 31, 2020, was \$288,814.90. The balance in the Building Fund was \$23,173.31. The Stained-Glass Window Restoration account balance was \$41,873.55.
- **b) Stewardship** No report.
- c) Parish Education Nothing new to report.
- **d)** Youth Nothing to report.
- e) Family/Youth Director Nicholas reported: He is promoting summer camp for non-confirmation students. He is also producing video lessons for high school students.
- a) **Worship** Jay Heil reported: They are working on Lenten services, which will be held on Wednesdays during lent.

- Worship times will be 10:00am and 7:00pm.
- f) Evangelism/Outreach No report.
- **g**) **Social Concerns** Judy Taylor provided a written report: One family was assisted with electricity.
- h) Christian Life Nothing to report.
- i) **Property** Michael reported the following:
  - **1.** Repaired toilets in the Educational Building.
  - **2.** Fixed the outside lights around the Sanctuary.
  - **3.** TLG had security cameras installed.
  - **4.** Replaced more smoke/carbon monoxide detectors at TLG.
  - **5.** Annual termite inspection completed all in good order.
  - **6.** Asphalt repair work is being researched in front of the Sanctuary.
  - **7.** Toilet was fixed in Parsonage 2.

#### **Lenten Schedule**



Due to the COVID pandemic, we have had to make adjustments to our Lenten Schedule. We will not be doing our normal Lenten Rotational, nor will we be serving meals prior to the midweek worship services, but we will be holding midweek services. The Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday, and Good Friday services will be similar to the

Dear Friends,

You have probably seen in the news that two COVID-19 vaccines have been authorized by the CDC. You may even know frontline health workers who have received their first dose. I thank God for the researchers,

volunteers, and experts who have worked tirelessly to create these vaccines.

Unfortunately, there are people in the world who try to capitalize on this new development to try and take our money or health information. There are already reports of scammers offering people early doses of a vaccine in exchange for a large sum of money. Earlier in the year, there were reports of scammers posing as Medicare representatives and asking people for their personal medical information, which can be used for fraud.

Here are some tips to help you recognize suspicious callers and to stay safe:

- If you've received an unsolicited call, never give out personal information such as Social Security Numbers, birthdate, Medicare number, credit card information, or passwords.
- Do not buy or accept offers for COVID-19 vaccines found in advertisements, emails, or unsolicited phone calls.
- Calls asking for money for a vaccine should be treated as fraud. Doses of vaccines that were purchased with U.S. taxpayer dollars will be provided to patients at no cost, other than an administration fee from your doctor.
- If a call seems suspicious, trust your instinct! Even if the phone number looks like your doctor's office, trust yourself if something seems off. Tell them you will call back at a more convenient time, then call a number you know is genuine.

 If a caller asks for donations for COVID related charities, research the charity before donating. Be especially wary of anyone requesting payments or donations in cash or by wire transfer, gift card or using the mail.

Currently, Phase 1A vaccine recipients include front-line healthcare workers and residents of long-term care facilities in Texas. People 65 years of age and older, and people over age 16 with at least one chronic medical condition will likely get the vaccine soon. If you have questions about the vaccine, contact your healthcare provider. Stay safe, and have a blessed New Year!
