Ash Wednesday on February 14 is the beginning of Lent and is about cleansing, and we hear the words, "You are dust and to dust you shall return". Ashes bring to mind fire -- the fire of Old Testament scriptures which destroyed evil cities

and made the people start new and fresh and clean again. Ashes were also one of the main ingredients in homemade soap. The word lent originally meant spring-time when fresh new growth begins.

Our time of Lent, beginning with Ash Wednesday and lasting 40 days excluding Sundays (Sunday is always an Easter celebration), is the time to reflect on Baptism

January 9, 2024 – 6:00pm

- 1) **CALL TO ORDER** The meeting of the Church Council of St. Paul Lutheran Church was called to order by Boyd Weise, president. Council members present for the meeting were Boyd Weise, Calvin Bruns, Linda Peyton, Terry Carmichael, Jay Heil, Hope Jendrzey, Cathy Moritz, Pam Hoefling, Larry Gohmert, Kristin Schustereit, and Pastor Tim Muehlbrad. Katie Serrano and Bill Klaevemann were also in attendance.
- 2) **DEVOTION** Boyd Weise provided the devotion.
- 3) **MINUTES** Pam Hoefling made a motion to accept the November 14, 2023, minutes as presented. Hope Jendrzey seconded the motion. The motion carried.

4) REPORTS

- a) **Treasurer/Stewardship** Calvin Bruns provided a written report and noted the end of year total was \$289,961.78.
- b) **Parish Education** No report.
- c) Youth Linda Peyton reported:
 - 1. We had our annual Christmas caroling event along with the Yorktown 4H on Sunday December 17, 2023. We had 3 trailers full of kids and adults ready to sing to our local residents. Afterwards, we all enjoyed soup and hot cocoa.
 - **2.** We will be holding bunco on Sunday, January 14, 2024, from 2:00 to 4:00 PM in the fellowship hall. Everyone is invited.

- **3.** We will be having our annual father/daughter dinner on Wednesday, February 7, 2024, from 6:00 to 8:00 PM in the Fellowship Hall.
- **4.** Our next committee meeting will be held on Tuesday, January 23, 2024, at 6:00 PM.
- d) **D.C.E.** Terry Carmichael reported:
 - **1.** Attended and gave the prayer at the Learning Garden Christmas Dinner on Dec. 5th.
 - **2.** Assisted Sarah Bargmann with the Sunday School Christmas Program on 12/10 and the practices beforehand.
 - **3.** Assisted with the Christmas Caroling on 12/17 by leading songs for one of the three trailer groups. We estimate we had about 80 people participate!
 - **4.** Played guitars with PT and Friends on Sat. and Sunday 12/23 and 12/24.
 - **5.** Planned and led the Children's Sermon on December 3rd,10th,17th, and 24th based on the meaning of the Chrismons.
 - **6.** Continue leading the weekly Learning Garden Chapel worships on Wed. mornings and distributing their chapel offerings to the church annex for the congregation to view.
 - **7.** Attended the Learning Garden Committee (CEM) meeting.
 - **8.** Have been meeting with and leading the Sr. High group during Sunday School.
 - **9.** Continue meeting with the FFF group on Wed. evenings.
 - **10.** Have been assisting Pastor with the Confirmation classes being held.
 - **11.** Have been looking at the Children's worship bags for the church services and suggestions for how they may be improved for the children's experience.
 - **12.** The youth decorated over 30 of the doors of the residents of the Yorktown Nursing Home for Christmas on Sat. Dec. 2nd.
 - 13. Assisted Kimberly Gaus with the Summer Camp

registration again this year and have been consulting with her as needed.

- **14.** Attended the following:
 - a) Girls Basketball game 1/5
 - b) YISD Elementary Christmas Program
 - c) Christmas Downtown
- **15.** Unfortunately, the Oromo kids will not be able to attend camp with our group this year; however, we will be working on attending together next year.
- e) Worship Jay Heil reported: Pastor will be taking vacation January 29 through February 5, 2024. Bill Klaevemann will be covering the sermons for both the Saturday night and Sunday morning worship services during this time.
- f) **Evangelism/Outreach** Hope Jendrzey reported: We participated in the Yorktown Chambers' Christmas downtown on December 7th with our complimentary popcorn. Thanks to all who helped make this a fun event for the children. The church pictorial directory committee met and has secured a photographer. We have volunteered at YAM.
- g) **Social Concerns** Cathy Moritz reported:
 - **1.** Assistance was provided to one individual in November 2023 \$100 for an electric bill.
 - **2.** Assistance was provided to two individuals in December 2023 \$100 each for water bills.
- h) Christian Life Pam Hoefling reported: On December 10, 2023, a catered Christmas meal was served with around 180 people in attendance. S&J Catering of Goliad served the meal and Christian Life prepared the dessert of cake and cherry fluff. Leftover plates were taken to some of the shut-in members.
- i) **Property** Larry Gohmert reported the following as of January 9, 2023:
 - 1. We are still waiting on parts for the church elevator.
 - **2.** We were able to get property and liability insurance from Brotherhood Mutual Insurance just in time for their coverage to become effective on January 1st,

when the policy with Church Mutual terminated. As expected, the new coverage is more expensive, but this did update the insurance valuations on the buildings, as well as adding several liability coverages that we have not had previously. At this point our Workers Compensation policy with Church Mutual is still in force, but I intend to move that to Brotherhood Mutual as soon as possible.

- **3.** TreeWerks has done a lot of trimming of the trees at the cemetery. They are not quite done yet but expect to return to complete the work very soon.
- **4.** I am looking into some discoloration of the air conditioning outlets in the Fellowship Hall kitchen. It might be mold, or it might be that the vents are just discoloring with age.
- 5. We have lost internet and telephone service a few times in the last few months, due to problems with our DSL service from AT&T. I am investigating the possibility of a fiber connection, which is what AT&T is trying to "herd" their customers into.
- j) Cemetery Nothing to report.
- k) **CEM** A written report was provided.
- a) Pastor Professional activities during November 2023 included: 8 worship services, 1 hospital visit, 9 home visits, 6 educational events, and 9 church meetings and events. Official acts in November included one burial. Professional activities during December 2023 included: 10 worship services, 1 hospital visit, 6 home visits, 5 educational events, 6 church meetings and events, and 1 week of vacation. Official acts in December included one burial.

5) OLD BUSINESS

a) **2024 Budget** – Larry Gohmert made a motion to approve the changes made to the proposed budget for 2024, which included increasing Church Insurance to \$55,000, increasing Social Concerns to \$3,500, and increasing Organist and Sunday Service Salary to \$9,500. Jay Heil seconded the motion. The motion carried.

b) **Nominating Committee** – All needed positions have been filled.

- c) Approve use of fellowship hall for a health fair 2-5-24 for DeWitt County AgriLife Extension Agency Cathy Moritz made a motion to approve the request for use of the fellowship hall on February 5, 2024, for a health fair for DeWitt County AgriLife Extension Agency, with the rental fee waived. Hope Jendrzey seconded the motion. The motion carried.
