I enjoyed the advertisements several years ago of the airline company with the slogan, “You want to get away?” People in the commercials found themselves in painfully embarrassing situations and truly wanted to escape. We have all found ourselves in situations and see no way out. Maybe our situations haven’t been quite as exaggerated as the TV commercials, but we still want to get away, to leave the mess behind, get a new handle on a problem, to take a vacation from all the stress, to find a new adventure that does not turn on us.

Worship time can be a “get away” time for us and our families. It is a time to step outside of the hecticness of life, gather together with the ones we love, and worship the God who has given us life and his saving grace.

I admit that church may not be as exciting as a roller coaster ride at Fiesta Texas, but spending time in worship will give you peace as you ride the roller coaster of life. Attending worship may not be as much fun as going on a long trip, but it will prepare you for that trip into everlasting life. Gathering together with other Christians is not a duty or an obligation. It is instead, a great privilege -- a gift from a loving God who knows our need to be refreshed.

Life would be great if we could escape from any situation that we don’t want to be in. Worship does offer a time to “get away”, but it is also more than that. Worship prepares us for those difficult situations. When we are refreshed in worship, we know that we have the strength of the Lord with us even when we ourselves are the cause of our own “situation”. God makes that promise in Psalm 121:8, “The Lord will keep your going out and you’re coming in from this time on and forevermore.”

If you need even more spiritual vacation than once a week, consider doing daily devotions! Begin with prayer: ask God to open your heart and mind so that you will be receptive to God's Word for you, pray for your friends and family, pray for your church and your pastor. Then read scripture, maybe beginning with the Psalms. Now sit back, close your eyes and reflect on what you have just read. You might want to keep a journal and write down your reflections or any questions that your reading has raised in your thoughts. Now close your devotion with prayer and the Lord's Prayer. You will be amazed what this 10 to 15 minute exercise can do for your sense of well-being.

Want to get away? We don't need an airline ticket to do it. We just need the assurance of knowing that God is with us in our going out and coming in.

Camp Sign Up

We need to get our campers signed up so we can start making plans. Our dates are July 13-18 at Camp Lone Star in LaGrange TX. If your child is Age 8-13 we have a place for them! The way to sign up is below (Note: it is a little different for those who are 13 by the time of camp as the camp system handles them differently):

For those that will turn 13 by July 13th do the following:

1. Go to the camp Lone Star website and set up an account.
2. Allow the registrar two working days to do the override
3. Then log in and complete the forms for registration (below is the registrar's email)

“Log into your account and fill out the remaining forms. They first need to set-up an account with us so that I have a record to add the registration too. Once I know that they all have an account I can manually register them. They will then need to complete their forms, medical information, and add money to their trading post account.

That should do it but let me know if you have issues.”

For those 12 and under:

You will register in the Pioneer program. Go the Camp Lone Star website and in The LaGrange site programs go to Pioneer Program as that is the group registration. You will need to know that it is the Group program entitled “Pioneer Program” and you will need the Group Hold Code or GHR Code: **SPYT2025**. Then you should be able to go and fill out the forms needed to complete the registration.

FOR BOTH GROUPS the Final Two Steps would be:
...to participate in the Camp Fundraising Spaghetti Lunch on Feb. 16th (Contact person is Kim Gaus)
...provide the church with a \$175 deposit that is refundable when your youth attends camp.

1. **CALL TO ORDER**- The meeting of the Church Council of St. Paul Lutheran Church was called to order by Boyd Weise, President. Council members present for the meeting

were Boyd Weise, Calvin Bruns, Laurey Garica, Jay Heil, Larry Gohmert, Pam Hoefling, Ashleigh Peyton, Jill Turner, Susan Franke, and Pastor Tim Muehlbrad. Katie Serrano and Terry Carmichael were also in attendance.

2. **DEVOTION-** Boyd Weise provided the devotion.
3. **MINUTES-** Pam Hoefling made a motion to accept the December 10, 2024, minutes as presented. Wade Bolting seconded the motion. The motion carried.
4. **REPORTS-**
 - a. **Treasurer/Stewardship-** Calvin Bruns provided a written report.
 - b. **Parish Education-** No report provided.
 - c. **Youth Committee Report-** Laurey Garcia reported:
 1. Caroling with the 4H was enjoyed by all who attended. We had approximately 50 people join us. A big thank you to all who provided vehicles, trailers, soup, and trimmings!
 2. The FFF Silly Sock Christmas Party was on December 18th and brought an end to our 2024 year. Everyone had a blast exchanging their gifts, eating, decorating cookies, and enjoying games inside and outside. We started FFF in the fall of 2022 with three youths, and we now serve thirty, with fourteen of those from our congregation. All glory goes to God as his Holy Spirit works through our youth to grow this ministry.
 3. Our next committee meeting will be held on Tuesday, January 28, 2025 @ 6 PM.

 - c. Assisted Pastor with youth readers for the Christmas Eve Services and worked with Pastor on getting them their parts.
 - d. Worked with Pastor on the planning of music choices for the Sunday School openings that correspond with SPARK curriculum for the Fall.

 - f. Worked with Pastor on possible summer camp destination and am now working on registration.
 - g. Have been planning and will lead the Rally Day games on 1/12.
 - h. Assisted the choir with its music that was performed on 11/22.
