Summer Camp Registration

It is now time to register the campers and place names into our reserved spots. Our dates are July 12-17 at Camp Lone Star in LaGrange, TX. We will have two age groups this year. The Alpha program is for those in our Confirmation program and those age twelve and under. Those not in confirmation who are 13 and above will be in the Omega Program. The registration procedure follows below but is a little different for those who are in the Confirmation program and will turn 13 by the dates of our camp. The camp system is set for age, not grade or program: For those in Confirmation that will turn 13 by July 17th do the following:

1. Go to the camp Lone Star website and set up an account.

2. Allow the registrar two working days to do the override.

3. Then log in and complete the forms for registration
(below is the registrar's email)

(From the registrar- "Log into your account and fill out the remaining forms. They first need to set-up an account with us so that I have a record to add the registration too. Once I know that they all have an account I can manually register them. They will then need to complete their forms, medical information, and add money to their trading post account.")

For those 12 and under and in Confirmation:

You will register in the Pioneer Alpha program. Go the Camp Lone Star website and in The LaGrange site programs go to Pioneer Program as that is the group registration. You will need to know that it is the Group program entitled "Pioneer Program" and you will need the Group Hold Code. You can obtain that code from Terry or the church office. Then you should be able to go and fill out the forms needed to complete the registration.

For those registering 13 year olds in the Omega program you will follow the procedure above for 12 and under. You will list your program in the Pioneer group as Omega.

FOR BOTH GROUPS the Final Step would be:

...provide the church with a \$175 deposit that is refundable when your youth attends camp.

Ashleigh Peyton will be attending as the female sponsor, and Terry will be attending as the male sponsor. We look forward to a great week together in July!

January 13, 2026 @ 6 PM

1. **CALL TO ORDER-** The meeting of the Church Council of St. Paul Lutheran Church was called to order by Boyd Weise, President. Council members present for the meeting were Boyd Weise, Calvin Bruns, Larry Gohmert, Jay Heil, Ashleigh Peyton, Pam Hoefling, Susan Franke, Wade Bolting, and Pastor Tim Muehlbrad. Terry Carmichael and Amanda Rodriguez were also in attendance.
2. **DEVOTION-** Boyd Weise opened the meeting with prayer.

3. **MINUTES-** Pam Hoeftling made a motion and was seconded by Jay Heil to accept the minutes from December 9, 2025, as presented. The motion carried.
4. **REPORTS-**
 - a. **Treasurer/Stewardship-** Calvin Bruns provided a written report.
 - b. **Parish Education-** No report provided.
 - c. **Youth Committee Report-** Laurey Garcia reported:
 1. FFF had a blast with their Silly Sock Christmas party and hayride on Wednesday, 12/17. It was a good time had by all!
 2. We had approximately 26 people who enjoyed caroling followed by soup and hot cocoa in the Fellowship Hall on Sunday, 12/21/25. Everyone enjoyed themselves and brought lots of Christmas cheer to many.
 3. A big thank you to Eric and Kim Gaus for providing the trailer and transporting everyone. We do so appreciate it! Thanks to everyone who brought soup; they were all delicious!
 4. Bunco was a blast! We had 20 people attend, mostly youth, and everyone enjoyed playing, snacking, and winning!
 5. Our next committee meeting will be on Tuesday, January 27, 2026, @ 6 PM.
 - d. **DCE-** Terry Carmichael reported
 1. Besides the normal duties (Childcare chapels, Sunday School, and other duties), the following were accomplished:
 - a. Have been providing elementary Sunday school teachers with downloading, then copying their new curriculum materials for the month, and then placing them in their binders in the classrooms.
 - b. Have been providing the 1st and 2nd grade classes with some supplemental ideas to go with their curriculum.

- c. Began the summer camping registration process for Camp Lone Star with the Pioneer Group's registration.
- d. Assisted Erin Koopmann with the Christmas Program, props, scenery, and practices as needed.
- e. Assisted Pastor with teaching the Confirmation Classes.
- f. Assisted with obtaining youth readers for the two Christmas Eve Worship Services.
- g. Assisted with the songs for the Christmas caroling.
- h. Assisted with the Worship Services on 1/3 and 1/4 by leading the second half of the services while Pastor was on vacation.
- i. I prepared two songs for the Christmas Eve Worship, including one with Gwen Kneese at the 4:00 p.m. service, based on her idea that included any children who wanted to participate.
- j. Attended Bunco Day on 1/11.
- k. Will be assisting Pastor with the guitar classes on Wed. evenings.
 - 1. Attended basketball and football games in town and out of town.
- e. **Worship-** Jay Heil reported:
 - 1. Pastor Tim is working with the local churches to finalize the Lenten rotation order.
- f. **Evangelism/Outreach-** Wade Bolting reported:
 - 1. Wade mailed off 4 visitor cards from the church.
- g. **Social Concerns-** Susan Franke reported:
 - 1. Assistance was provided to 1 individual in December 2025.
 - a. Provided help with two individuals with rent (\$100.00)
- h. **Christian Life-** Pam Hoefling reported:
 - 1. On December 14, 2025, a catered Christmas Meal was served, with 100 people in attendance. S&J Catering of Goliad served the meal, and the congregation provided desserts.

- i. **Property-** Larry Gohmert Reported:
 - 1. I have a quote from Ameritex Elevator Texas, LLC, for a new maintenance contract for our elevator. I believe we should start with them immediately. Their initial price is \$500 per quarter, to be paid quarterly. We are still under contract with TKE until late this year, but I believe we should let them know that their services are no longer required. We will need to pay out the remainder of our contract with TKE and send a “do not renew” certified letter later this year. Ameritex asks that we send TKE a formal written notice that TKE is no longer welcome on our site, and I believe we should do that.
 - 2. Ameritex has also provided a detailed proposal for modernizing our elevator’s electrical, electronic, and hydraulic systems. Their quote is \$108,955. At some point, we will need to address this.
 - 3. Cathy’s Carpet is expected to be here on Monday, January 19th, to begin installation.
 - 4. I am working with Mary Ressman concerning replacement pecan trees. I should have taken care of this sooner, but we should be able to get this done soon.
- j. **Cemetery-** No report provided.
- k. **C.E.M.** Tracie Fielding provided a written report.
- l. **Pastor-**
 - 1. Professional activities during **December** 2025:

- d. Youth Sports Complex- We are continuing to collect money for the project. A deposit has been sent to reserve the project with Rafter J.

5. NEW BUSINESS

- a. Annual meeting agenda - Besides the normal agenda items, the following business will be up for vote during the meeting:
 1. Changes in the constitution for the Youth Representative have been sent out. When the representative is elected for this term, they will be on a two-year term. The changes will be ratified at the 2027 Annual Meeting, and then the next term will be a one-year term.
 2. Endowment Bylaws have been reworked and need only one vote by the congregation.
 3. NALC Constitution Ratification has been put out. This can be voted on once by the congregation.
 - b. Elevator Maintenance: Larry Gohmert made a motion to terminate our TKE contract, to begin a new maintenance contract with Ameritex beginning Feb. 1, 2026, and to send a certified letter of non-renewal with TKE in July. Pam Hoefling seconded. The motion carried.
 - c. Jay Heil made a motion to approve Pastor Tim's vacation from April 6th to 13th, 2026. Pam Hoefling seconded. The motion carried.
6. **CLOSING-** Wade Bolting made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Jay Heil seconded the motion. The motion carried, and the meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.


