When you receive this newsletter, Christmas will be just days away. And soon after will come New Year's Eve and the New Year. On January 6 the 12 days of Christmas celebration will end. On that day we celebrate the coming of the wise men to honor the Christ-child. This celebration is called "Epiphany" -- epiphany" being the Greek word for "manifest". What was made manifest on this day so many centuries ago was that Christ was revealed to the Gentiles (all those apart from the children of Israel). The wise men were from far away and were not a part of the Hebrew people, yet they came to worship Him. The season which follows the Day of Epiphany is also called Epiphany, and in worship services we will be reading the stories of how Jesus was being revealed to all people.

"Manifest" means to make evident or to make certain by showing or displaying a truth. This manifestation continues yet today. It continues through the preaching and teaching of God's Word; it continues through worship, singing and prayer; it is carried out through evangelism, stewardship, youth activities, social ministry, even church property maintenance. The baby Jesus, whom the wise men worshiped, is still revealed and made evident to people today. Anytime we act according to our Christian teaching in our daily lives, when we strive to "do what is right" by faith, or we try to follow Christ's example, we are making the Lord manifest to others. Through our involvement in the church, on committees, as leaders, teachers, ushers, altar guild, and as volunteers of all stripes, we are helping to manifest Christ to the world.

As the New Year approaches, it would be good if each of us would examine ourselves and see just how we are or are not

manifesting Christ in our lives. What are our actions and lifestyle revealing to others, a love for Christ and His ways, or self-centeredness, self-gratification, and pettiness? Are we really putting forth an effort to help our congregation manifest Christ in and through



all of its varied ministry? Take in the Epiphany and take some time to rededicate ourselves and our lives to Christ and to making Christ manifest in our neighborhood and world.

December 8, 2020

- 1) CALL TO ORDER The meeting of the Church Council of St. Paul Lutheran Church was called to order by Clem Waskow. Katie Serrano was also in attendance.
- 2) **DEVOTION** The devotion was given by Michael Melanson.
- 3) **MINUTES** The minutes from November 5, 2020, were approved as printed with no corrections.
- 4) REPORTS
 - a) **Treasurer** Calvin reported: The balance in the General

Fund as of November 30, 2020, was \$281,057.96. The balance in the Building Fund was \$13,067.68. Calvin Bruns made a motion to accept the report as written. Linda Hurta seconded the motion. The motion carried.

- b) Stewardship Budget will be discussed in New Business
 c) Parish Education Linda Hurta reported: Sunday school has been reopened as of October 4, 2020. Attendance averages are as follows: Nursery/Kindergarten 10; Elementary/Junior High 13. Attendance would probably be higher if this was a normal year. Adult classes have been cancelled until further notice. Temperatures are taken, but social distancing is not able to be practiced well. Most students wear face coverings, but not all. Filming of the Christmas Program video has been completed. Each family that has a child or children in the video will receive a jump drive of the Christmas story. It will also be shown the weekend of December 13th at both the Saturday and Sunday services. Christmas bags will be prepared to be handed out at the three Christmas Eve services. Each bag

A smoke/carbon monoxide detector in the toddler room at TLG was replaced. A diaper changing station for the infant room was assembled. A soap dispenser was changed at TLG. The toilet was fixed in the cry room in the Sanctuary.

- m) **Pastor** Professional activities during November 2020 included: 7 worship services, 6 home visits, 6 educational events, 7 church meetings and events, 4 burials, and 1 baptism.

It has taken a toll on all of us. We are doing the best that we can however, we miss having visitors and seeing the families walk their children into the classrooms. It is weird having to take the staff, children, and family's temperatures every morning. Then monitoring the staff and children's temperatures throughout the day. Asking them questions if they have been around anyone with COVID-19, or if anyone has had a fever in their home.

Who knew that when this happened, we would become essential workers! You would think that having that title would make us feel proud and honored however, it has made us see how we have to be stronger than ever. We have always done what we could to make sure that every single child that walks through our door is not stressed and has a great day. Now it means so much more. They see us in masks

A center in Victoria that I have helped, and they as well have helped us, is now closing due to COVID-19. It really scary how many child care centers have not made it through the pandemic. It really pushes me to do everything that I can to make sure this will not happen to us. The families need us! We need them! Everyday seeing all of these amazing children smiling, learning, and having fun makes it so enjoyable to come to work. It is all about the children!

When I took over as Director, I knew I would be blessed and love working at The Learning Garden. I knew that I would be challenged and have challenges to overcome however, I have learned so much in the past year. I have learned that I can overcome obstacles that I have never had to handle before, I would have to be the best leader that I could be, I would have to lift my staff's spirits more than ever and be there even more for my TLG families. During this whole time, the kindness from the staff, board, and congregation members makes my heart happy.

The most important lesson that I have learned from all the ups and downs that I have had in my life and especially with this past year was "God does not give us more than we can handle!"

We all just need to breath, pray, and take it one day at a time!
