- 1. CALL TO ORDER- The meeting of the Church Council of St. Paul Lutheran Church was called to order by Boyd Wiese, President. Katie Serrano and Terry Carmichael were also in attendance.

- 2. Laurey has contacted SZS and relayed that we are no longer looking into building a pavilion.
- 3. Possibly interested in pursuing a property across on Gohmert street. The property has a house that sits on roughly ½ acre, and another piece of the property has a shed sitting roughly on another ½ acre. The owner is not going to give his asking price until the beginning of the 2025 year while working with a real estate agent. This property would be able to accommodate FFF and future presenters.
- d. Educational Building Windows Update
 - 1. The windows have been ordered and will take from 6-12 weeks to be manufactured. The company will call when the windows are ready, and then they will call to schedule an installation date. The approximate timeline for installation is in February. So far, we have collected \$33,360.00 and we still need 23,825.00.

- e. Jay Heil made a motion to approve Rosa Horton as a new member of our congregation. Wade Bolting seconded the motion. The motion carried.
- 7. **CLOSING-** Jay Heil made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Laurey Garcia seconded the motion. The motion carried, and the meeting closed with The Lord's Prayer.


