

CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

ST. PAUL LUTHERAN CHURCH

June 16, 2020

- 1) CALL TO ORDER The meeting of the Church Council of St. Paul Lutheran Church was called to order by Clem Waskow, president. Council members present for the meeting were Pastor Tim Muehlbrad, Clem Waskow, Cathy Moritz, Linda Peyton, Linda Hurta, Calvin Bruns, Nicholas Requejo, Jay Heil, Michael Melanson, Judy Taylor, Martha Geffert, and Kristin Schustereit. Also attending were Katie Serrano, Victor Riske, Bill Klaevemann, Pam Hoefling, and Dennis Henze.
- 2) **DEVOTION** The devotion was given by Linda Peyton.
- **3) MINUTES** The minutes from May 5, 2020, were approved as printed with no corrections.
- 4) REPORTS
 - a) Treasurer Calvin Bruns reported: The balance in the

- General Fund as of May 31, 2020, was \$308,632.27. The balance in the Building Fund was \$16,560.41.
- **b) Stewardship** Nothing to report.
- c) Parish Education Linda Hurta reported: Sunday school has reopened as of June 7th. Attendance has been close to what it would have been on a normal summer schedule during the last two Sundays. The elementary group has a one-room Sunday school class for grades kindergarten through 8th grade. They are trying to do as much social distancing as they can.
- **d)** Youth Nothing new to report.
- e) Family/Youth Director Nicholas reported: He has been having children's sermons in church on Sunday mornings, as well as making a video version. He has been planning backup ideas for the Christmas program. He has a trip to Splashway Water Park scheduled for Sunday, August 2nd.
- **f**) **Worship** Will be discussed in Old Business, COVID-19 Response section below.
- g) Evangelism/Outreach Nothing to report.
- h) Social Concerns Nothing to report.
- i) Christian Life Nothing to report.
- j) Property Michael reported: He called Blank Irrigation to fix the water sprinkler system in front of the educational building. New A/C unit was replaced in the meeting room. Trees were sprayed for worms. The back gate was knocked down at parsonage 2. A police report was filed. Bosart replaced handles on the Fellowship Hall doors.
- **k)** Cemetery Victor reported: He has sold 4 spaces since the last meeting.
- l) **CEM** A written report was provided. Nothing to add.
- m) Pastor Professional activities during May 2020 included: 5 worship services, 1 home visit, 4 church meetings and events, 1 professional meeting, 1 community event, 1 burial, and 1 wedding.

5) OLD BUSINESS

- a) Stove Michael explained two burners are constantly lit with a pilot, and the other burners must be ignited with a push button.
- b) Stained Glass Windows Repair Bill Klaevemann has

been working on getting information regarding repairs for our stained glass windows. He has received bids from three different companies as follows: Associated Crafts & Willet Hauser (\$70,466), The Cavallini Company (\$88,942), and Foster Stained Glass (\$172,180). Discussion was held concerning what all repairs need to be made. Bill called each company on speaker phone so that all those present for the meeting could hear. He asked each company several questions to clarify our understanding of work to be done. After discussion, council voted to accept the bid from Foster Stained Glass out of Bryan, Texas, for \$172, 180.

c) Electronic Giving – Katie informed us there were four contributions since electronic giving was set up, for a total of \$426.99 so far. We pay \$10 per month for the service, and you are allowed to choose where your contribution goes.

d) COVID-19 Response

- 1. Sanitation The Learning Garden has plans to purchase a system they will use to thoroughly sanitize the center. The church will also purchase a mist-sprayer for \$639.00 and purchase the sanitizer from TLG.
- 2. Sunday Service Increase capacity to 50%? Pastor expressed concerns about increasing attendance capacity to 50%. He has noticed members are not practicing social distancing, and many are not wearing masks. It was decided we will not increase our capacity to 50% just yet, and it was reiterated ushers must wear masks during communion service.
- **3. Saturday Service** Saturday service will be opened back up starting June 27th in the Fellowship hall.
- **4. Sunday School** Parents and children are strongly encouraged to wear masks and use hand sanitizer to prevent the spread of any illness at this time.
- 5. Youth Nicholas is going to look into the guidelines public school sports are following to use as an example for his gatherings.
- **6.** Funerals Will continue to follow the same

- recommendations as we are now.
- **7. Weddings** Will continue to follow the same recommendations as we are now.
- **8.** Other meetings and Functions Will continue to follow the same recommendations as we are now.
- **9. Fellowship Hall Rentals** We will continue to keep rentals on hold until further notice.
- **10. Opening Church Office** Katie will be working in the church office from 8:00am until 12:00pm Monday through Friday, and the afternoons she will work from home.

6) NEW BUSINESS

- a) Security at Parsonage 2 We don't feel there's a need for a security system at this time.
- **b)** Cemetery Lawnmower The mower needs to be replaced.
- c) Tree Trimming Michael has called TreeWerks.
- **d) Street Repair** Michael is going to look into having this done.
- 7) **CLOSING** Jay Heil made a motion to adjourn. Cathy Moritz seconded the motion. The motion carried.

The meeting closed with The Lord's Prayer.
