With summer upon us there is that temptation to take a three-month worship break from church. It is too easy to rationalize that we can worship God for a summer on a golf course or fishing.



At the time of this writing it is 9:38 PM. Ashley and I have just come back from night worship with our campers. Tonight's worship was at the

creekside sanctuary. Tomorrow (the morning of 6/15) some of our youth will participate in the morning worship. Even though it is day two of camp, we still have a long week ahead of us. I am very thankful for this group of young kids coming to camp. They may not know it but they are small pioneers for our church. This is either the first elementary group to come to camp or the first group in a long time to come to camp.

What some of you may not know about Crosstrails Ministry is that it has a really unique camp philosophy. "We want to safely take you out of your comfort zone". How is this applied? Every counselor tells these kids that they want them to try new things. As every camper is escorted to each event they are encouraged to try the activity. This week we had a young girl who knew she could not swim. However, she wanted to take the swim test. The swim test consists of swimming the width of the pool and treading water for fifteen seconds. The issue for some kids is, the test takes place in the deep end of the pool. So our child got into the pool, she made sure she was close to the wall, she swam the entire width but struggled coming back to the starting side. She did not pass her swim test. What I loved was her ability to attempt the test! She was extremely out of her comfort zone.

I am very grateful for you, St. Paul, for sending these kids out to camp. There are other stories like the one above.

Go talk to the kids who came to camp to hear their individual stories. Trust me they are very excited to tell you about their incredible week. To the parents who sent their kids this week, thank you! What I love about camp is for an entire week our youth are completely isolated from the rest of the world. While we are isolated our focus is entirely on God.

Katie Serrano and Nicholas Lee were also in attendance.

### 2) **BUSINESS**

a. Parking Lot Project – Bill Klaevemann has done extensive research collecting bids for both asphalt and cement work. Boyd Weise made a motion for council to recommend to the congregation: We recommend the bid from T&S Paving if asphalt is used at this time, and the bid from Martin Martinez if concrete is used at this time. We recommend concrete; however, we do not currently have funds for this project. We are asking for monies to be designated for this project. Hope Jendrzey seconded the motion. The motion carried.

- b. Parking Lot Curbing Curbing installation was approved at the April 12, 2022 meeting.
  Bill Klaevemann made a motion to table any action of curbing in the parking lot at this time.
  Pam Hoefling seconded the motion. The motion carried.
- c. **WiFi Access Points** Bill Klaevemann made a motion to accept the bid of \$5,110.28 from Flexile Systems to install two WiFi access points in the Fellowship Hall. Linda Peyton seconded the motion. The motion carried.




