CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

ST. PAUL LUTHERAN CHURCH

May 5, 2020

 CALL TO ORDER The meeting of the Church Council of St. Paul Lutheran Church was called to order by Clem Waskow, president. Council members present for the meeting were Pastor Tim Muehlbrad, Clem Waskow, Cathy Moritz, Linda Peyton, Linda Hurta, Calvin Bruns, Nicholas Requejo, Jay Heil, and Kristin Schustereit. Also attending were Victor Riske and Katie Serrano.

- 2) **DEVOTION** The devotion was given by Nicholas Requejo.
- 3) **MINUTES** The minutes from April 7, 2020, were approved as printed with no corrections.

4) **REPORTS**

- a. Treasurer Calvin Bruns reported: The balance in the General Fund as of May 5, 2020, was \$242,765.74. The balance in the Building Fund was \$13,841.32. Calvin made a motion to accept the treasurer's report. Cathy seconded the motion. The motion carried.
- b. Stewardship Nothing to report.
- c. Parish Education Linda Hurta reported: Lessons for Sunday school are being sent every two weeks.
 Summer material has been ordered. All teachers agree to hold off on having Sunday school until at least June. They will reevaluate at the end of May.
- d. Youth Linda Peyton reported: They are exploring the idea of adding more children's sermons into the worship service. They are also looking to meet with the youth group on Wednesday evenings.
- e. Family/Youth Director Nicholas Requejo reported: He has been calling families to check in. A recap summary of lessons for confirmation students has been sent. Videos of children's sermons are now being made. Also, a YouTube page has been created for our church. The page is unlisted, so you are not able to search for it. You have to have a link directly. The grocery pick-up and delivery is continuing.
- f. Worship Reported in New Business.
- g. Evangelism/Outreach No report.
- h. Social Concerns No report.

- i. Christian Life Cathy Moritz reported: All future activities are on hold for now.
- j. Property Clem reviewed the written report: Annual termite inspection conducted/cleared; Sprayed for insects at all properties; Elevator inspection complete/passed; Parsonage 2 back gate was kicked in police report filed; Gohmert Air made repairs to A/C units at TLG and A/C unit for church office; Stove was delivered to the Fellowship Hall. Longhorn plumbing repaired a leak in a sink at TLG.
- k. Cemetery Victor reported he sold two lots last week.
- 1. **CEM** Printed report was available. Nothing to add.
- m. **Pastor** Professional activities during April 2020 included:

4 worship services, 1 home visit, 4 church meetings and events, 2 professional Zoom meetings, and 5 burials.

5) OLD BUSINESS

- a. Stove The stove was delivered May 5, 2020; however, it is not sure if it is the correct equipment. Issues include: stove is hot all the time, odor of gas is noticed in building, we cannot reach the valve inside the building to turn off gas to the stove – Gas Company has to come and turn off at the meter. The equipment company will be contacted tomorrow.
- **b.** Stained Glass Windows Repair Waiting on one more bid to present.
- c. Hand Sanitizers We will see if we can find any bottles to have available in the church. Katie will call DeWitt Poth to see if they have any available.
- d. Electronic Giving Katie answered questions we had

at previous meeting: There is no contract to use the service. It costs \$10 per month, plus 2.75% for debit or 1% for ACH transactions. There will be an option for users to choose what fund their offering will go to (i.e. building fund, CEM, general fund, etc.). Kristin made a motion to proceed with setting up electronic giving with Vanco Payment Solutions. Calvin Bruns seconded the motion. The motion carried.

6) NEW BUSINESS

- **a.** Opening Church Church will be reopened for members on May 17, 2020. Discussion was held concerning wearing masks, how to monitor the number of people entering church, etc. The following guidelines will be followed: Masks will be highly encouraged (Katie will order a box of 50 disposables); Communion will be held every Sunday and will be given at the steps; Every other pew will be marked off for no seating; Members will be encouraged to spread out if not from same household.
 - Weekend Worship Services We discussed opening up a Wednesday service instead of a Saturday service because there is not enough room to spread out in the chapel and not enough time between Saturday and Sunday for virus to dissipate. We will revisit this idea in June after seeing how Sunday service attendance goes.
 - **2.** Sunday School Discussed in Youth section above.
 - **3. Funerals** Graveside only services will continue for now.
 - 4. Weddings A policy will have to be made for

having weddings during this time.

- 5. Other Meetings and Functions We will leave the responsibility of this to the leader of groups – if they can meet safely, they are welcomed to proceed.
- 6. Fellowship Hall Rentals Closed for now.
- **7. Opening Church Office** Will remain closed for now.
- **b.** Approve Ray Lange for Convocation Delegate Jay made a motion to approve Ray Lange as a delegate to the Convocation convention.
- 7) **CLOSING** Jay Heil made a motion to adjourn. Linda Hurta seconded the motion. The motion carried.

The meeting closed with The Lord's Prayer.



Procedures for Returning to Worship in the Sanctuary and other Functions of the Church

(May 5, 2020)

For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven. (Ecclesiastes 3:1)

At our May 5th Church Council meeting, the Council decided it was time to reopen the Sanctuary for worship services; however, we want to do it safely following the civil authorities' guidelines. The precautions that will be in place are as follows:

- 1. The date for beginning to hold worship in the Sanctuary will be Sunday, May 17.
- If you are not feeling well, please stay home. If you do not feel comfortable coming back to church at this time, you are still welcome to listen to the radio broadcast at 100.1 FM or on the livestream at our church website: <u>www.stpaulykt.org</u> and click on the link: <u>Shoutcast</u> <u>Audio Stream</u>. Bulletins will also be available.
- 3. Please respect other people. People have a wide range of viewpoints, opinions, and experiences with the pandemic and the handling of it. We can love one another as Christian brothers and sisters even when we disagree.
- 4. Currently, the safe capacity for attendance has been determined to be 100 persons based on full capacity of

the sanctuary being 400. This number will be increased as reopening Texas continues with new COVID-19 cases remaining manageable by health entities and local medical resources.

- 5. Facemasks are highly recommended. The use of facemasks are not intended to keep the user safe, but to keep the other people around you safe. Remember, you can have few or no symptoms and still be contagious to someone who will be unable to tolerate the disease as well as you can. Our Lord instructed us to love our neighbor as ourselves. Let us strive to do this by taking the actions necessary to protect our fellow brothers and sisters even it may feel uncomfortable or strange. Please bring your own facemask, but if you do not have one, we will have some available at the entrances to the sanctuary.
- 6. Hand Sanitizers will be available at entrances. Feel free to use them before and after services.
- 7. Keep every other pew vacant (signs will be posted on the pews). Households may sit together; otherwise, keep at least six feet of space between you and the next person.
- 8. Offering plates will be left at the entrances and brought forward at the offering time in the service. They will not be passed through the pews.
- 9. Attendance cards may be left in the pews close to the center aisle or dropped in the baskets at the exit when the service is over.

- 10. Holy Communion will be continuous (not at the rail) using the individual cups. We will strive to maintain a safe 6-foot social distance as we come to communion. Servers will wear masks and gloves. Used cups will be dropped into a container. Holy Communion will be offered every Sunday so that we do not exclude anyone.
- 11. At this time Acolytes will not be needed.
- 12. Normal cleaning of the Sanctuary should suffice unless we have more than one worship service within a 48 hour period.
- 13. Opening Saturday Services will be delayed until more thought is given to this and to what new purpose this service may serve. The Saturday service cannot be held in the Chapel because there is not enough space to spread out. We may want this as a dedicated service for those who are over 65 or those having underlying health issues, or we may need this service if our Sunday service has more attendees than is safe to be able to spread out. Another option may be to have a midweek service so that we do not have back-to-back services in the Sanctuary. Whichever is chosen, we will follow the same procedures above for conducting the Saturday Service.
- 14. All other worship services in the sanctuary (Weddings, Funerals, Memorial Services, etc.) will follow the same procedures as the Sunday morning worship service.

- 15. At this time we will not be using the fellowship hall for any large gatherings (potlucks, funeral receptions, hall rentals, etc.).
- 16. The decision to have small groups meet (committee meetings, Bible Studies, work groups, etc.) will be left up to the small group leader, if they can meet safely.
- 17. Dates have not yet been set for the opening of the church office or for Sunday School for the children and youth.


