These past fifteen months of COVID-19 have been a struggle that has affected each one of us one way or another: sickness, death, loss of jobs and businesses, quarantine, inability to see loved ones, loss of travel, mandates to wear mask, frequently washing hands, wearing gloves, social distancing, limiting occupancy in buildings, school closures and distance learning, working from home, canceling events, and a slew of numerous other changes in our lifestyle. Through it all God has walked beside us every step of the way and is now leading out.

The pandemic affected the Church also, and as you know, many changes to the way we normally do ministry took place. We had to think creatively of how to do ministry in this new context. I am thankful to be able to say that we never missed a Sunday worship service – we actually added a few extra worship services, and as far as I know, no transmission of the disease has been traced to a church function at St. Paul Lutheran. Early in the pandemic I encouraged people to stay home and listen on the radio or livestream until we learned more about the disease. Since May 2020 more and more people have slowly been coming back to in-person worship.

Now it is time to make changes once again. The pandemic is still ongoing. People are still contracting COVID-19 and getting sick, going to the hospital, and dying, but the widespread threat is decreasing because more and more people are being immunized against the virus. The pandemic is not over -- we are not out of the woods, yet, but we can see daylight, and so the church is moving to ease up on the safety precautions that were put in place during the pandemic. On May 11, 2021, the Church Council approved a motion to make the changes that will begin on May 29.

Worship – In-person occupancy will not be limited and the signs on the pews will be removed. Masks are recommended but are optional. The format of the worship bulletin will remain the same, and bulletins will still be available outside the Ed Building doors and on the website for those who choose to listen on the radio and internet. Offering plates and attendance cards will remain at the entrance ways to the church. No-contact Passing of the Peace will be included in the service. Communion will be offered each week using individual cups, and the drive-thru communion will continue until the Eucharistic Ministry is functioning again (possibly in June). Children will be invited to come forward for the Children's Sermon. Acolytes will be able to be a part of the service once a schedule is put together. The Saturday service will need to be moved out of the Fellowship Hall due to other events using that space. The Chapel has limited space and would be crowded for the number of people currently attending; therefore, the service will be held in the Sanctuary for the time being beginning on May 29.

Funeral and Memorial Services – Occupancy will not be limited, masks will be optional, and the Servant Ministry will be able to host food and fellowship gatherings for the families and guests.

Weddings -- Occupancy will not be limited and masks will be optional.

Fellowship Hall – The Fellowship Hall will be available for meetings, church functions and rentals.

Committees – Ministry events and functions will be determined by the committee chairs and the committees.

Parish Ed -- Sunday School is open and VBS is being planned. Youth and Family events are also being planned.

Visitation – Pastor and Eucharist Ministry will be making home and hospital visits as allowed by the institutions.

Added Worship Service – If there is sufficient interest, we will add another worship service that has strict safety guidelines for those who are not comfortable with the relaxed safety precautions of the other services. Please contact the church office if you are interested. These past fifteen months has been a time to test patience, discernment, flexibility, and creativity. One of the first communications that I sent out when the pandemic started and safety precautions were put in place included a quote from "Whether One May Flee From A Deadly Plague" written by Martin Luther in 1527 during the Black Plague in Europe that came in waves for over 300 years. I include that again.

"Therefore I shall ask God mercifully to protect us. Then I shall fumigate, help purify the air, administer medicine, and take it. I shall avoid places and persons where my presence is not needed in order not to become contaminated and thus perchance infect and pollute others, and so cause their death as a result of my negligence. If God should wish to take me, he will surely find me and I have done what he has expected of me and so I am not responsible for either my own death or the death of others. If my neighbor needs me, however, I shall not avoid place or person but will go freely, as stated above. See, this is such a God-fearing faith because it is neither brash nor foolhardy and does not tempt God.

Moreover, he who has contracted the disease and recovered should keep away from others and not admit them into his presence unless it be necessary. Though one should aid him in his time of need, as previously pointed out, he in turn should, after his recovery, so act toward others that no one becomes unnecessarily endangered on his account and so cause another's death. 'Whoever loves danger, says the wise man, will perish by it' [Ecclus. 3:26]." p132.

CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

ST. PAUL LUTHERAN CHURCH

May 11, 2021

- CALL TO ORDER The meeting of the Church Council of St. Paul Lutheran Church was called to order by Clem Waskow. Council members present for the meeting were Pastor Tim Muehlbrad, Clem Waskow, Cathy Moritz, Linda Peyton, Linda Hurta, Calvin Bruns, Michael Melanson, Hope Jendrzey, and Kristin Schustereit. Katie Serrano, Nicholas Requejo, and Bill Klaevemann were also in attendance.
- 2) **DEVOTION** The devotion was given by Nicholas Requejo.
- 3) **MINUTES** The minutes from April 13, 2021, were approved as printed with no corrections.
- 4) **REPORTS**
 - a) Treasurer The balance in the General Fund as of April 30, 2021, was \$276,821.24. The balance in the Building Fund was \$9,345.00. Calvin Bruns made a motion to accept the treasurer's report as printed. Hope Jendrzey seconded the motion. The motion carried.
 - b) Stewardship Nothing to report.
 - c) Parish Education Linda Hurta reported: A teacher's meeting was held on Sunday, May 2nd, 2021, with seven teachers and Tina Boehm (VBS coordinator) attending. Mother's Day ideas were discussed. Rally Day is set for August 29th. Activities will be finalized later in the summer. Teachers were informed where the panic button is located in the basement and whether fire and active shooter drills were to be held. The teachers agreed that the

children should not be subjected to these drills, since the children should view the church as a safe place, but that the teachers know what to do and where to go in each of these situations. All Sunday school teachers are in favor of fully opening the church. To increase Sunday school attendance, post cards will be sent to invite children back and to let them know they have been missed. Nursery will conduct their summer curriculum separate from the elementary. Elementary will be using the one room Sunday school concept, along with learning a song of the books of the Bible. Each teacher will choose a Sunday to teach the combined grades, thereby enabling teachers with more time off. The guitar players will also have the summer off. Tina Boehm explained VBS has been tentatively set for July 12th-16th, depending on the council's decision to fully open the church. Times are to be determined. She will check with the Methodist and Presbyterian churches to see if they would like to join us. This will not be considered a community VBS.

- d) Youth Linda Peyton reported: Nicholas has YAM events on the summer schedule. A summer schedule is being made to have more activities to do with youth if we open during the summer. A Splashway water trip is planned for August 7th.
- e) **Family/Youth Director** Nicholas Requejo reported: Project H is coming along nicely – We have collected 193 items so far, and are expecting more as the end of the month nears. He is finished with teaching confirmation lessons.
- f) **Worship** No report.
- g) Evangelism/Outreach Hope Jendrzey reported: She attended a presentation by Yorktown News-View on advertising and received a free ad to be used by the end of May. She requested a proof of an ad that includes "Thanks and applause for our First Responders, Healthcare Workers, and Essential Workers from St. Paul Lutheran". The committee ordered single stem carnations to be handed out at both Mother's Day services.
- h) Social Concerns Cindy Parma reported: There were no

requests for assistance in the month of April.

- i) Christian Life Nothing to report.
- j) **Property** Michael reported the following:
 - 1. Annual elevator inspection is complete.
 - **2.** Fixed toilet in ladies' restroom in the Educational Building.
 - **3.** Smoke detectors went off again at TLG. Fire department was called again. TLG is looking into replacing the current detectors with commercial-grade smoke detectors.
 - **4.** Bill Klaevemann fixed the door handle that came off of the door to the Educational Building.
 - 5. A new housekeeper, Jannette Stifflemire, was hired.
- k) **Cemetery** Nothing to report.
- 1) **CEM** Written report was provided.
- m) Pastor Professional activities during April 2021 included: 14 worship services, 1 hospital visit, 4 home visits, 5 educational events, 7 church meetings and events, 1 wedding, and 1 baptism. Pastor also reported on the NALC Pastor's Ministerium he attended and noted the following items: Younger people need to be encouraged to go into ministry; the importance of Holy Communion was stressed; the focus of church should be about being Christcentered, preaching the gospel, and giving sacraments; the headquarters of NALC is planned to be moved to Dallas/Fort Worth area.

5) OLD BUSINESS

a) Stained Glass Windows Repair – Bill Klaevemann explained the stained glass window work is finished, but they are now waiting for AAA to finish work before the windows can be reinstalled. They are 3-4 weeks out from completion, depending on the weather. Painting will begin once that is finished and plexiglass is removed. After cleaning the brick, border will need to be redone. This will be an additional \$3,800.00. The total for the stained glass window project, including this extra cost, is \$262,550.00. Michael Melanson made a motion to approve the \$3,800.00 additional cost of painting. Linda Hurta seconded the motion. The motion carried.

- b) **Coronavirus** Statistics were discussed concerning hospitalization and vaccination rates. Council reviewed list of ideas for loosening safety precautions as follows:
 - 1. Occupancy Back to 100%
 - 2. Signs on pews Remove
 - **3.** Bulletin format Keep same except put announcement back at beginning of service.
 - 4. Bulletins in pickup box Keep same for now.
 - 5. Masks Recommended, but optional.
 - 6. **Pastor mask/gloves** Continue to wear mask at communion, but no more gloves.
 - 7. Offering/Announcement Cards/Pass out bulletins Keep same for now.
 - 8. Passing Peace Verbal, no contact.
 - 9. Announcements Move back to beginning of service.
 - 10. Communion at rail Keep current as is for now.
 - **11. Drive-thru Communion** Continue for at least another month.
 - **12. Saturday Service place** Needs to be moved out of Fellowship Hall to Sanctuary.
 - 13. Daycare Chapel Will start up again.
 - 14. Funerals No occupancy limit, masks optional.
 - **15. Servant Ministry** Will be able to host food and fellowship gatherings.
 - 16. Weddings No occupancy limit, masks optional.
 - **17. Fellowship hall rental** Will be available for meetings, church functions, and rentals.
 - **18. Meetings** Will be determined by meeting leaders.
 - **19. Church social events** Will be determined by committee chairs.
 - **20. Youth programming** Will be determined by Nicholas and committee.
 - 21. Sunday School Open
 - 22. VBS In process of being planned.
 - **23. Home/Hospital/Nursing home visits** Visits will be made as allowed by the institutions.
 - **24.** Nursing home services Will be conducted as allowed by institution.
 - 25. Eucharistic Ministry Will be started up again

(possibly in June).

- **26.** Acolytes Will be used again, once a schedule is put into place.
- **27. Children's Sermon** Children will once again be invited to come forward.
- **28.** Adding Worship Service A third service with safety requirements may be offered. Please call Katie in the office if interested.

Michael Melanson made a motion to open up St. Paul Lutheran Church on May 29, 2021, with the above discussed precautions. Linda Hurta seconded the motion. After a vote by show of hands, the motion carried.

- 6) **NEW BUSINESS** None to discuss.
- CLOSING Cathy Moritz made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Michael Melanson seconded the motion. The motion carried, and the meeting closed with The Lord's Prayer.


