The information and story for this article is taken and adapted from the May - June 1996 issue of “Emphasis” and part is borrowed from a friend’s newsletter.

Father’s Day was conceived by Mrs. Jon Bruce Dodd of Spokane, Washington while she was attending a Mother’s Day church service in 1910. Friends encouraged Mrs. Dodd to share her ideas with the Reverend Conrad Bluhm, president of the Spokane Ministerial Association. The Association reviewed and approved the idea, and the local YMCA gave it extensive publicity.

Mrs. Dodd pressed for national recognition for her idea of a Father’s Day. She had suggested June fifth as the day to honor the fathers of our country. This was the date of her father’s birthday, and she wanted to honor him for the splendid job he had done in raising his six motherless children. In 1936, a national Father’s Day Committee was formed in New York City. The third Sunday in June was selected as the date for the observance. In 1971, a congressional endorsement and a presidential proclamation made Father’s Day a nationally accepted commemoration.

Fathers don’t always realize how important it is for them to spend time with their children. When he was a boy, Henry Brooks Adams was proud of his father, Charles Francis Adams, who was the ambassador to Great Britain. One day young Henry Adams made this entry in his diary: “Went fishing with my father. The most glorious day of my life.”

Henry grew up and became an historian, a philosopher, and a Pulitzer Prize winner for his book, The Education of Henry Adams. Yet, that day spent with his father was so memorable to him that he was making references to it thirty years later. How sad it is then to contrast what Charles Francis Adams, the father, wrote in his diary on that same significant date: “Went fishing with my son. A day wasted.”

Think about how such misplaced priorities can affect a child.

It's been said that until a boy (or a girl) is 14 years old, they do what the father says; after that they do what the father does. Fathers!! Dads!!! Father Figures!!! Did you read that? What you do and what you do NOT do has an impact on your child.

May God have mercy on our souls as we all, fathers, mothers, grandparents, aunts and uncles pay attention to our responsibilities. And thanks be to God for the help that God sends to us.

May 14, 2024, at 6 PM

1. **CALL TO ORDER-** The meeting of the Church Council of St. Paul Lutheran Church was called to order by Boyd Weise, President. Council members present for the meeting were Boyd Weise, Calvin Bruns, Jay Heil, Jill Turner, Laurey Garcia, Wayne Sparck, Pam Hoefling, Larry Gohmert, Ashleigh Peyton, and Pastor Tim Muehlbrad. Terry Carmichael and Katie Serrano were also in attendance.

2. **DEVOTION-** Terry Carmichael provided the devotion.
3. **MINUTES-** Jay Heil made a motion to accept the April 9, 2024, minutes as presented. Pam Hoefling seconded the motion. The motion carried.
4. **REPORTS-**
 - a. **Treasurer/Stewardship-** Calvin Bruns provided a written report.
 - b. **Parish Education-** Jill Turner reported:
 1. Update on Vacation Bible School: Tina Boehm still needs three to four adults to lead groups during Vacation Bible School.
 2. Terry Carmichael is working on 13 lessons for Sunday school this summer.
 - c. **Youth-** Laurey Garcia reported:
 1. The “Battle of the Ages” Church Picnic was attended by approximately 60 people! The children played games indoors but had fun! Everyone enjoyed the hotdogs and hamburgers and especially the watermelon! Nothing says summer like delicious watermelon!!
 2. The Mother’s Day Brunch was a success. We had about 37 moms in attendance and a lot of positive feedback!
 3. The Youth Committee will be hosting a Father’s Day Taco breakfast on June 16, 2024, during the Sunday School hour. Again, our youth will serve their fathers to show their gratitude for all their fathers do in their lives.
 4. God is working through our youth as they are beginning to spread the word and are inviting their friends! Our numbers for Faith, Food, and Fun are steadily growing! We are up to 14 youth! They are having a blast sharing a meal, having fellowship, studying God’s Word, and playing games!! What a blessing!! FFF will continue through the month of June. We will be off the month of July through the first part of August and then we will start again.

 - 6. Assisted Pastor with the Confirmation classes on 4/21 and 5/5.
 - 7. Continue the monitoring of the Children's worship bags for the church services.
 - 8. Have been working on the Continental Youth Gathering plans. We have 6 young ladies registered along with myself and Ashleigh Peyton as sponsors. We have met twice now and will be holding a Bake Sale Fundraiser on June 2nd.
 - 9. Met with Youth Building Task Force on 4/18 for an architect interview and 5/7 to go over those interviews.
 - 10. Worked on the Church Picnic on the Sunday School and games portions. Had to adapt the games to inside games due to threatening weather.
 - 11. Working with Pastor on possible youth led worship service on May 18th and 19th and the theme, content, and youth participation.
 - 12. Working with Jill Turner on the Summer Sunday School curriculum and plans.
 - 13. Worked with Pastor in leading the Sunday School during Mother's Day.
 - 14. Attended the Learning Garden Graduation Ceremony.

 - b. Attended several Little League softball games.
 - c. Attended the Jr. High softball game in Stockdale.
 - d. Several Learning Garden meetings on summer and next year's chapel schedule.

- g. **Social Concerns-** Wayne Spark reported:
 1. One person called in for help with their water bill, which makes this the 5th person St. Paul has helped this year. He anticipates more requests during the summer months.
- h. **Christian Life-** Pam Hoefling reported:
 1. April 14, 2024, a Potluck was held. There was a very low attendance, approximately 30 people.
 2. Another potluck will be held this Sunday, May 19th.
- i. **Property-** Larry Gohmert reported:
 1. Work continues on installation of the standby generator for the Educational Building. The plan is to connect the generator, transfer switch, and other electrical components this Friday, May 17, which means the Educational Building will be without electricity for that day. We're still working on getting Natural Gas to the generator. We have a commercial plumber working with Centerpoint Energy, so hopefully that installation will be completed soon.
 2. Coastal Bend Power has replaced the non-functional light bulbs in the sanctuary.
 3. Many thanks to Mark Lincke and his sister who have been working on archiving many old church records, organizing them and compiling them into useful volumes. In the course of doing that, it was realized that a lack of ventilation of the church vault has been causing some mildew problems. After consulting with air conditioning professionals, it was decided to install a Fire-Rated Louver into the vault door. Thanks to Steven Hoefling for installing the Louver.

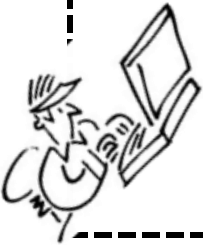

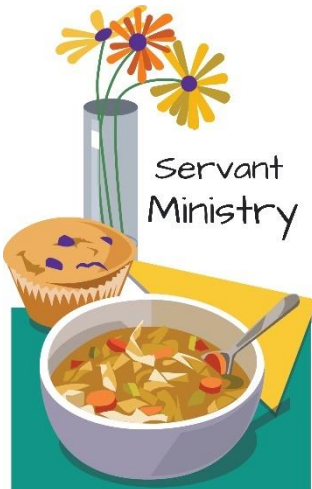

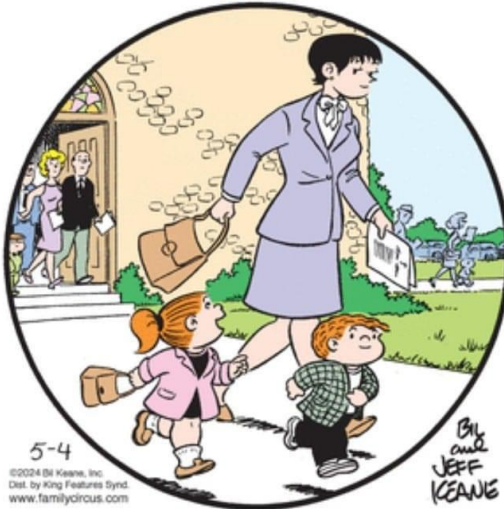
