Jesus Christ died on Friday, April 3, 33 AD.

That is the conclusion of two Oxford University Scientists, Colin J. Humphreys and W.G. Waddington. Their finding was published in the "British Science" Magazine.

These men used the Bible, astronomy, and other historical sources to come to their decision on this date. Reconstructing the Jewish calendar, dating a lunar eclipse and through a series of complicated and closely reasoned calculations, and processes of elimination they came up with the year and date.

Whether these men are correct or not we do not know, and personally I don't think that it makes any difference to my faith whether I know the exact date or not.

The importance of the events is not exactly when Christ died or exactly where he was buried. (There are at least two tomb sites which people argue over where he was buried.) What is important is that Jesus the Son of God and the Son of Man was crucified and died for your and my salvation; and that He arose to give you and me new life, now and in eternity. This cannot be proven in a scientific test tube, but in

our faith and in our lives through the power of the Holy Spirit.

It is this power which has led God's people, the Christian Church, through the centuries. And it is this power and love of God that



we commemorate again this Lenten Season, Holy Week and Easter.

An Interesting Month...

March finds us in the middle of Lent and the month ends with Easter. It illustrates the journey we make during this church season. The joy of Christmas, Epiphany, and Jesus' Baptism just passed. But now we shift to travelling the road with Jesus to

the cross. It is a time for looking at ourselves and our life of faith.

The children will be burying the word "Alleluia" for Lent. Our hymns will take a more thoughtful and reflective tone. All this is as it should be. Lent is more than giving up things. It is about focusing on our faith and its meaning in our lives. It is about what Jesus and His life means to us!

And yet it is not a completely sad or depressing time. Martin Luther said that every Sunday is a little Easter. In the words of the Lenten hymns and texts there can be found joy!

Within this journey the story of Jesus contains Palm Sunday, the Passover (while solemn, it is a celebration and Jesus uses it as a backdrop for our Lord's Supper), and, on the way to Jerusalem, Jesus raises Lazarus from the dead. If you think about it, even this time of Lent is itself a time of celebration. It is celebrating our faith, the gift of Jesus to our lives, and the place he has in our lives!

Psalm 51:11 says...Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me.

That's why I say Lent is more about adding rather than subtracting. It is a time for us to be in worship and Sunday School to hear about His word and the power in it for us. It's, also, important to be in each other's company sharing that word and how it has meaning in our lives! There are some aspects of our faith you just can't get by yourself. They go beyond the worship and learning here. There is a distinct benefit for our faith in being in the community of faith!

So, we began this journey with celebration turned to examining our faith. But the story continues back to celebration! The Alleluia returns at the Easter Egg hunt and the celebration doesn't end at the cross!

The last few days an illustration of this Lenten journey to celebration could be seen here. It first seemed a frightening sight on top of our church spire. I walked out the door for two days and a buzzard was perched on top of the cross. That is an interesting sight. But then I realize that this symbol, that we identify with death, is defeated by the same symbol he sits on! The cross is empty! Death came but it had already been defeated because the cross and tomb are empty! He is not there! Jesus turned what seemed an ugly sight into one that showed His power. Death and evil tried to turn the cross into a symbol to be feared. But, Jesus, by humbling himself, showed he has power over death and the cross!

Come be a part of this wonderful Lenten journey and then the celebration of Easter! May you find new meaning and strength in your life of faith!
