1. **CALL TO ORDER-** The meeting of the Church Council of St. Paul Lutheran Church was called to order by Boyd Weise, President. Council members present for the meeting were Boyd Weise, Laurey

- Garica, Jay Heil, Larry Gohmert, Pam Hoefling, Ashleigh Peyton, Susan Franke, and Pastor Tim Muehlbrad. Terry Carmichael and Aydn Garcia were also in attendance.
- 2. **DEVOTION-** Pastor Tim Muehlbrad opened the meeting with a prayer.
- 3. **MINUTES-** Pam Hoefling made a motion to accept the January 7, 2025, minutes as presented. Laurey Garcia seconded the motion. The motion carried.

4. REPORTS-

- a. **Treasurer/Stewardship-** Calvin Bruns provided a written report.
 - 1. Pastor Tim reported that there is a correction on balance sheet with the Money Market Account at Citizen's Bank- 16% offering benevolence. Money wasn't being zeroed out by putting the funds back into the Citizen's Bank Operating Account. The annual report said approximately \$50,000. This has now been transferred back into the Operating Account which, as of the end of January, had approximately \$89,000.
- b. Parish Education- No report provided.
- c. **Youth Committee Report-** Laurey Garcia reported:
 - 1. We had approximately twenty people join us for Bunco on January 26, 2025. Everyone had lots of fun.
 - 2. Our first Mother and Son Dinner was a success! All our guests enjoyed themselves. I am IMMENSELY proud of our FFF youth for the fantastic job they did! They did such a wonderful job serving all the different courses on the menu as well as the drinks. Thank you to Kim Gaus for her lesson in etiquette and to Terry Carmichael for his

- after-dinner program. A great big thanks to Chef Chaieyz Garcia and his wife, Scarlet for all their hard work on the delicious food. I would also like to thank Kim Gaus, Linda Peyton, Chaieyz Garcia, Scarlet Garcia, and all our youth who cleared dishes, scraped and put dishes into the wash, washed dishes, dried dishes, and helped put away clean dishes. This event would not have been a success without each one of you!
- 3. Our spaghetti dinner and bake sale fundraiser for camp is next weekend 2/16 from 10:30 PM to 12:30 PM. There were approximately 201 tickets sold. Thank you, Kim Gaus, for heading that up. Kim has let everyone know what time to be at the Fellowship Hall to come and help. If you have any questions, please contact Kim Gaus.

- 5. Our next committee meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, February 25, 2025 @ 6 PM.

6. Youth Task Force

- a. I have received all the bids now for what it would cost to put a roof with lights and basketball hoops over the elevator parking lot.
 - 1. Victoria Steel Erectors placed two bids. One was for a structure that is 56'x56' x12' with a cost of \$50,500.00 and one was 65'x 64'x14' with a cost of \$63,200.00.

- 2. VP Construction submitted a bid for a 60'x60'x14' and 2" on a 12 pitch with a cost of \$113,000.00
- 3. Rafter J Construction gave us a bid for a 56'x56'x12' covering at a cost of \$59,900.00
- 4. All council members have received a copy of each bid.
- d. **DCE-** Terry Carmichael reported:
 - 1. Besides the normal duties (Childcare Chapels, Sunday School, and other duties) the following were accomplished:
 - a. Performed with PT & Friends on 1/26.
 - b. Continue working on camp registration and several contacts with the camp on registration questions and some youth attendance inquiries.
 - c. Met with Jill Turner on summer and start of Fall Schedule 9 (Note: Rally Day has been set for Sunday, August 24th)
 - d. Assisted with part of the program for the Mother and Son Event.
 - e. Assisted Pastor with a water heater leak in the childcare center.
 - f. Met with Lori Kneese on a program for Palm Sunday during the Sunday School hour.
 - g. We asked and produced a scholarship recommendation letter for one of the Sr. High youths.
 - h. Met with the Childcare Director about whether the recent Federal

- Program cutbacks impacted any of the programs that they receive.
- i. Assisting Luellen Smiley with some choices for possible choir songs.
- j. Attended several varsity girl basketball games.

 - 1. Christian Life prepared a chili meal after our Congregational Meeting with 53 people in attendance.
 - 2. February 9th, a potluck and a new members recognition was held with 63 people in attendance.
- i. **Property-**Larry Gohmert Reported:
 - 1. A member of the congregation has offered to pay toward replacing the two playground benches that were recently removed. The Learning Garden would like them installed in the same locations as the previous benches. I am looking at options.
 - 2. The church elevator recently had a problem, but it has been repaired.

- 3. An intermittently leading water heater in the Learning Garden has been repaired-hopefully the repair is permanent.
- 4. I have signed us up for the maintenance contract on the backup generator with Loftin Equipment Company.
- 5. We could really use a "handyman" for all the little repairs that are constantly needed in and around buildings. I would appreciate any suggestions.

 job. An interview task force will be developed
 to interview potential candidates for the
 position.
- 7. **CLOSING-** Jay Heil made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Laurey Garcia seconded the motion. The motion carried, and the meeting closed with a devotion led by Pastor Tim.




