But each person in worship can also invest themselves to assure the most enrichment and meaningful experience possible.


- Use the time during the prelude to prepare yourself for worship by carefully reading the prayers and the Scriptures for the day, or some Psalms in the hymnal, or the chosen hymns and songs for the day. Also pray for the worship and for all those leading the worship.
- Sing all of the hymns and liturgy with gusto and with thought. Ponder what you are singing so that your singing will be “unto the Lord.”
- Speak silent, brief prayers for the minister and other participants in the service.
- During the sermon, listen carefully to discover just what the Word of God is saying to you about your faith and Christian living.
- During the offering, pray that God will multiply our gifts of love as Jesus multiplied barley loaves and fish.
- Make all the prayers offered at the altar your prayers by listening carefully and responding when asked.
- After the sacrament, thank God that He has given you the privilege to be a guest at such a special banquet. Ask God to help you live a more Christ-like life.
- After the service, thank God for all who have served you this day, including all of the other worshippers. When

you leave the sanctuary make it a point to greet as many people as possible and become acquainted with those whom you do not know well.

- Plan to be back the next time God's people gather for worship.

A service of worship is a rare privilege that many in our world do not have or do not know. You can help to make it all that God intended by making the most of every worship opportunity.

Summer Camp Registration

We need to get our campers signed up for the spots we have reserved in the Pioneer Program. Our dates are July 12-17 at Camp Lone Star in La Grange TX.

This is done online on the Camp Lone Star website. For all age groups there is a special code you will need to register. If you have not received that code, or have misplaced the text with it in it, contact Terry. Note: it is a little different process for those who will turn 13 yrs old and are attending with our Confirmation campers in the Alpha program. It follows:

For those in Alpha Program (Confirmation) that will turn 13 by end of our camp dates:

Go to the camp website and set up a Pioneer account using the code.

1. Allow the registrar two working days to do the override
2. Then log in and complete the forms for registration
(below is a copy of the registrars' email with those details)

Go to the website and the Pioneer Program registration. They first need to set-up an account with us so that I have a record to add the registration too. Once I know that they all have an account I can manually register them. They will then need to complete their forms, medical information, and add money to their trading post account to finish the registration process.

For Those 13 and older and have completed confirmation
you will be registering under the older Omega group. You will set up your Pioneer account. The only difference is under the Pioneer Program you will be indicating it is for the Omega portion.

For those 12 and under register under the Pioneer Alpha program:

You will register in the “Pioneer Program” and the Alpha portion of the program.

FOR ALL the final Step and now due is to provide the church with a \$175 deposit that is refundable when your youth attends camp.

CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING

February 10, 2026 @ 6 PM

1. **CALL TO ORDER-** The meeting of the Church Council of St. Paul Lutheran Church was called to order by Boyd Weise, President. Council members present for the meeting were Boyd Weise, Laurey Garcia, Larry Gohmert, Jay Heil, Ashleigh Peyton, Pam Hoefling, Susan Franke, Wade Bolting, and Pastor Tim Muehlbrad. Jeremy Kneese, Aydn Garcia, Linda Hurta, Terry Carmichael, and Amanda Rodriguez were also in attendance.
2. **DEVOTION-** Pastor Tim opened the meeting with a devotion on Matthew 18:15-22 and how that has shaped our conflict policy. It was requested by a council member to include the policy statement in the newsletter.
3. **MINUTES-** Wade Boling made a motion that was seconded by Pam Hoefling to accept the minutes from January 13, 2025, as presented. The motion carried.
4. **REPORTS-**
 - a. **Treasurer/Stewardship-** Calvin Bruns provided a written report.
 - b. **Parish Education-** No report provided.
 - c. **Youth Committee Report-** Laurey Garcia reported:
 1. We had 37 fathers and daughters attend the Father-Daughter Dinner. The menu consisted of barbecue brisket, baked mac-n-cheese, green beans, a roll, garden salad, and a choice of cheesecake or make-your-own sundae! Everyone seemed to have an enjoyable time. Thank you to Terry Carmichael for

putting the program together. Thank you to everyone who helped with decorating, cooking, serving, and cleaning! None of this would be possible without each of you!

2. The FFF youth have been invited to come and play bingo again with the residents at the Yorktown Manor, Saturday, 2/28 @ 2 PM. Please come and join us! The residents are so thankful and truly enjoy having us there!
3. This Wednesday, February 11, 2026, will be our last FFF until after Easter. I will be here in the parking lot to walk to each Lenten service with whoever would like to join us. We leave the parking lot at about 5:45 PM. Instead of giving something up for Lent, how about you add a walk to your week instead?
4. Our next committee meeting will be on Tuesday, February 24, 2026, @ 6 PM.

d. **DCE**- Terry Carmichael reported

1. Besides the normal duties (Childcare chapels, Sunday School, and other duties), the following were accomplished:
 - a. Have been providing elementary Sunday school teachers with downloading, then copying their new curriculum materials for the month, and then placing them in their binders in the classrooms.
 - b. Have been providing the 1st and 2nd grade classes with some supplemental ideas to go with their curriculum.
 - c. Have been working with the summer camping registration process at Camp Lone Star with the Pioneer Group's registration. We have 10 campers confirmed attending out of our original 17 spots reserved.
 - d. Assisted Pastor with teaching the Confirmation classes.
 - e. Attended the Father-Daughter Dinner on 2/4 and provided the programming for the evening.

- f. Will be assisting Pastor with the guitar classes on Wednesday evenings.
- g. Attended multiple age groups' basketball games to support our youth on those teams.
- h. Attended the Nordheim Stock Show on 1/31.
- i. Assisted with weather preparations and preparations for the cancellation of services on the weekend of 1/24 and 1/25.
- j. Attended the 1st 2026 VBS organizational meeting on the afternoon of 1/18.
- k. Finished moving out of the office so that the carpet could be replaced in the DCE Office and Chapel. I am now in the process of moving things back in and reorganizing the office.

e. **Worship-** Jay Heil reported:

- 1. Lenten services are set for Wednesday mornings and evenings.
- 2. Order forms for Easter lilies.

f. **Evangelism/Outreach-** No report provided.

g. **Social Concerns-** Susan Franke reported:

- 1. Assistance was provided to 1 individual in January 2026.
 - a. Provided help for one individual with electric (\$100.00)

h. **Christian Life-** No report provided.

i. **Property-** Larry Gohmert Reported:

- 1. I have a correction to my estimate of last month about the date range of the certified letter that we will need to send to TKE Elevator about not renewing their maintenance contract. The range of dates during which the letter must be sent is August 2, 2026, to September 1, 2026, in order to fall within the stated 90 to 120 days prior to automatic renewal.
- 2. As of this writing, I am still waiting to see if TKE is going to release its contractual claim on our elevator's maintenance. AmeriTex is ready to assume the maintenance duties, and I have sent them a signed contract dated February 1, 2026.

3. Cathy's Carpet has completed the flooring in the Chapel, Terry's office, and the lounge. They have been paid.
4. Several members have expressed to me the thought that maybe we shouldn't replace the dead pecan trees at all, or that perhaps we should consider replacing them with a different kind of tree, like some sort of evergreen.
5. The Learning Garden has reported mold in the air conditioning ductwork in the two-year-old classroom. ServPro of Victoria has done this sort of cleaning for us previously, and they are scheduled to be here on Thursday, February 12, 2026, to check on it

- d. Boyd Weise read Amanda Rodriguez's resignation letter to the council. Laurey Garcia made a motion to accept Amanda Rodriguez's resignation letter. Pam Hoefling seconded the motion. The motion carried. Jay Heil moved to approve Katy Serrano as a temporary replacement, after Amanda's last day, until a replacement is hired and trained. Wade Bolting seconded. The motion carried. Church check signers were reviewed and will be updated at our next council meeting in March. Pam Hoefling made a motion to create a committee of four people to hire a replacement for Amanda. The committee will include the Council President, Pastor Tim, and two others who will be appointed by the President. Laurey Garcia seconded the motion. The motion carried.

7. **CLOSING-** Jay Heil made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Larry Gohmert seconded the motion. The motion carried, and the meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.



**POLICY ON DEALING WITH QUESTIONS, CONCERNS,
SUGGESTIONS AND COMPLAINTS**
(adopted February 2006)

1. That all members affirm their right to express their opinions about Life and Ministry in the congregation.
2. The congregation operates with a “direct democracy” form of government which allows members to share their opinions directly with the church council and at congregational meetings.
3. When members of the congregation express an opinion to a member of the council, the council person shall ask, “What would you like me to do with this information?”
 - A. If the member desires to have the information transmitted to the council, the member shall be invited to personally bring the information to the next council meeting. The time and date shall be given.
 - B. If the member does not wish to appear in person, the council member shall ask the member for permission to use their name in reporting. If permission is not given then the council member shall say, “I am sorry, but I will not be able to report to the council since we do not deal with anonymous letters of comments.”
If permission is given the council member shall report the information to the council and use the member’s name.
4. The only council member who shall not be available to bring such reports to the council is the congregational president. The president shall refer members to other members of the council.
5. Each question/concern/suggestion/complaint shall be placed on the agenda and written in the minutes along with the action taken by the council. Action may include: “Received as information”, “Pastor and President to visit member and report at next meeting”, etc.
6. All questions/concerns/suggestions/complaints may be shared in writing with the council and shall be handled in the above mentioned manner if the letter or statement is signed.


