#### CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES ST. PAUL LUTHERAN CHURCH

April 12, 2022 – 7:00 pm

- 1) CALL TO ORDER The meeting of the Church Council of St. Paul Lutheran Church was called to order by Clem Waskow. Council members present for the meeting were Pastor Tim Muehlbrad, Clem Waskow, Boyd Weise, Bill Klaevemann, Linda Peyton, Hope Jendrzey, Cindy Parma, Cathy Moritz, Pam Hoefling, and Kristin Schustereit. Kim Hahn, Nicholas Lee, and Katie Serrano were also in attendance.
- 2) **DEVOTION** The devotion was given by Kristin Schustereit.
- 3) **MINUTES** The minutes from February 8, 2022, were approved as printed with no corrections.

#### 4) REPORTS

- a) Treasurer/Stewardship Cindy Parma made a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report as presented. Bill Klaevemann seconded the motion. The motion carried.
- b) **Parish Education** Linda Hurta provided a written report: Sunday school attendance continues to improve. The children have received a Lenten Devotional color page with stickers that have daily Bible readings on them to be used during the 40 days of Lent. On April 10<sup>th</sup> (Palm Sunday), Sunday school will participate in the usual Palm procession during the church service. Also on Palm Sunday, Lori Kneese has planned a Seder meal for the elementary aged school children in the Fellowship Hall with the help of Nick Lee and the junior high youth. On April 16<sup>th</sup> (Holy Saturday), The Easter Egg Hunt starts at 10:00am in the Fellowship Hall. Nick Lee, with the help of the junior high youth, will present the Easter story followed by the egg hunt outside. The youth will hide the eggs. Refreshments will be served in the Fellowship Hall following the egg hunt.

#### c) **Youth** – Linda Peyton reported:

- 1. Inside church: Preparing for Easter; Helped host Seder meal for elementary youth; Continuing to work with TLG for Wednesday Chapel; Recruiting some parents to be on the youth board.
- **2.** Outside church: Outlaw Pass (14 youth, 6 parents)
- **3.** Future events: Bowling will be moved to a summer event; Mid Coast Services we will

help organize their warehouse/help wherever they need us; Summer Camp – One parent and Nicholas will attend Camp Chrysalis with our elementary youth; Confirmation Camp – Nicholas will attend Camp Chrysalis with our confirmation youth.

- d) **Family/Youth Director** Nicholas had no additions to the report.
- e) Worship Boyd Weise reported: All positions have now been filled for Good Friday's readings. Boyd will check with our flower vendors to be sure we have Poinsettias and Easter Lilies for next year. He is also looking for fill-in pastors to substitute whenever Pastor is on vacation. As a reminder, the Oromo Congregation will be attending our church on June 26.

The committee is wanting to make a few changes to our church service to get back to our pre-covid services.

- Communion will continue to be held each Sunday, but we will begin using the rail again on the first Sundays of each month and on Festival Days beginning in May. Communion will be done by intinction when not at the rail.
- Passing of the peace at the end of the service will begin again.
- Pastor will shake hands after service as congregation is leaving.
- f) Evangelism/Outreach Nothing to report.
- g) **Social Concerns** Cathy Moritz reported: No requests for assistance were received for the month of March 2022.

- h) Christian Life Pam Hoefling reported: Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper was hosted on March 1, 2022, and there were approximately 40 people in attendance. The committee has also planned a potluck for May 15<sup>th</sup> and a Taco Bar for July 24<sup>th</sup>. The Christian Life Committee consists of Kristin Schustereit, Johanna Warwas, Carlea Hahn, Susan Wieland, Anna Foerster, and Pam Hoefling.
- i) **Property** Bill Klaevemann reported the following as of January 2022:
  - 1. Spotlight installed at cemetery flagpole.
  - 2. Ceiling fan repaired in toddler room at TLG.
  - **3.** Landscape committee completed flower beds at the entrance to the church.
  - **4.** Waiting on bids for tile replacement in TLG.
  - **5.** Received bid of \$3,500 to replace AC unit in TLG.
- j) Cemetery Kristin Schustereit reported: Decoration Day is set for April 24<sup>th</sup>.
- k) CEM Written report was provided.
- 1) Pastor -
  - 1. Professional activities during March 2022 included: 19 worship services, 7 hospital visits, 6 home visits, 10 educational events, 16 church meetings and events, and 1 community event.

#### 5) OLD BUSINESS

a) Parking Lot Pavement – We have received three bids for parking lot asphalt hot mix pavement but are waiting on a fourth bid. Curbing was recommended on the north side of the parking lot, where the grass grows. Bill has received a bid for \$3,800 to have this curbing completed. Boyd Weise made a motion to go forward with the

installation of curbing along the north side of the main parking lot with the bid for \$3,800. Hope Jendrzey seconded the motion. The motion carried.

#### 6) **NEW BUSINESS**

- a) NALC Online Convocation Delegates This year's event will be online. We aren't sure how many delegates we will need to attend, but we will need delegates to attend in order for us to vote. The convocation will be held August 5<sup>th</sup> at 6:00pm, and August 6<sup>th</sup> at 4:00pm.
- b) Cemetery Records Kristin Schustereit presented information about Chronicle, a company that specializes in digitizing cemeteries. She presented a proposal which outlined the cost: \$500 for surveying and mapping, \$3,600 for creating a digital cemetery, and \$240/year for Chronicle software license. Bill Klaevemann made a motion for Kristin to move forward with Chronicle to digitize the St. Paul Lutheran Church Cemetery. Hope Jendrzey seconded the motion. The motion carried. Boyd Weise volunteered to help by attending online training with Kristin.
- c) 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Budget Plans are in the works for a celebration. The event will be held October 30<sup>th</sup>, 2022. The committee will meet again on May 10<sup>th</sup> at 10:00am. Anyone interested is invited to attend.
- d) **Oromo Gifts** Boyd Weise made a motion to send \$150,000 to the Oromo Church, with funds exclusively from 2022. Bill Klaevemann seconded the motion. The motion carried.
- e) **Graduate Scholarships** As the cost of college continues to steadily rise, our scholarship has not

- followed suit. The Scholarship committee recommends to increase the amount. The current scholarship amount is \$1,200. No action taken at this time.
- f) Parish Ed Council Position Linda Hurta has made a verbal announcement to resign from her position as Parish Education chairperson. Kim Hahn attended the meeting to speak about the concerns of the Sunday School teachers as to who will be conducting the opening for Sunday School. She suggested perhaps Nicholas could step in to have the opening for all youth, first grade and up. We need a volunteer to fill in for the Parish Education Council position. Please prayerfully consider.
- g) Handicap Ramps Bill Klaevemann received a bid for \$3,600 to build a concrete ramp in front of the church and to concrete the area currently covered by asphalt under the awning at the entrance to the Educational Building. Boyd Weise made a motion to move forward with the concrete work for \$3,600 to construct a concrete ramp in front of the church and to concrete the area currently covered by asphalt under the awning at the entrance to the Educational Building. Pam Hoefling seconded the motion. The motion carried.
- 7) **CLOSING** Pam Hoefling made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Bill Klaevemann seconded the motion. The motion carried, and the meeting closed with The Lord's Prayer.


