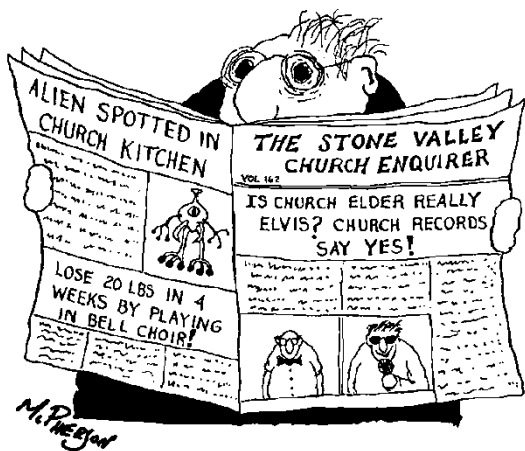
understand what's going on, how they can get involved, and what they are to do.

Terry Carmichael and Katie Serrano were also in attendance.
2. **DEVOTION-** Ashleigh Peyton opened the meeting with a prayer.

3. **MINUTES-** Jay Heil made a motion to accept the March 11, 2025, minutes as presented. Pam Hoefling seconded the motion. The motion carried.

4. **REPORTS-**

- a. **Treasurer/Stewardship-** Calvin Bruns provided a written report.

- b. **Parish Education-** Jill Turner reported:

2. 13th Palm Sunday: Lori Kneese planning “Did You Know” event walk through Holy Week and Sunday School Procession with the Palms at the beginning of the Worship Service

 2. PaPaw's Plumbing repaired a major leak in a water line underneath the Educational Building and is recommending that we redo the plumbing throughout the building. I have requested quotes from PaPaw's as well as from M.E. Plumbing for the replacement of the plumbing throughout the building. M.E. Plumbing replaced major pipes in the church basement in 2019.
 3. Handy Stop Nursery in Yoakum has 6-foot-tall pecan trees for \$68 each. Their varieties include Kiowa, Mohawk, Desirable, and Pawnee. For planting of the trees, they gave me contact information for Ashley Jacobs, who does landscaping. I should hear from her shortly. I also contacted Ressenman Tree Service and Nursery concerning replacement pecan trees and expect to hear from them soon.

4. Our standby generator passed its first quarterly inspection with no problems found.
5. Installation of the new windows on the Educational Building is scheduled to start on Monday, April 21st and will probably take 5 to 6 days to complete.

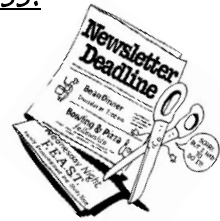
