

## CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

### ST. PAUL LUTHERAN CHURCH

October 13, 2020

- 1) **CALL TO ORDER** The meeting of the Church Council of St. Paul Lutheran Church was called to order by Clem Waskow, president. Council members present for the meeting were Pastor Tim Muehlbrad, Clem Waskow, Cathy Moritz, Linda Peyton, Linda Hurta, Calvin Bruns, Nicholas Requejo, Michael Melanson, Judy Taylor, Martha Geffert, Jay Heil, and Kristin Schustereit. Also attending was Katie Serrano.
- 2) **DEVOTION-** The devotion was given by Jay Heil.
- 3) **MINUTES-**The minutes from September 8, 2020, were approved as printed with no corrections.
- 4) **REPORTS**
  - a) **Treasurer** – Calvin reported: The balance in the General Fund as of September 30, 2020, was \$285,890.01. The balance in the Building Fund was \$24,700.97. The stained glass windows balance was \$34,536.57. Calvin Bruns made a motion to accept to report as written. Linda Hurta seconded the motion. The motion carried.
  - b) **Stewardship** – Calvin reported: He has gone to HEB to talk to them about chickens. Prices are expected to be higher this year.
  - c) **Parish Education** – Linda Hurta reported: Sunday School classes are now open for face to face classes. There were 18 children in attendance this past Sunday. Most are coming wearing masks. They are social distancing as

much as possible. They are organizing for the Christmas program, which will be a video production. The children will be recorded in groups. They are hoping to get the production posted on the St. Paul Facebook page and the church website. Christmas bags will be handed out at the Christmas Eve service.

- d) **Youth** – Linda Peyton reported: The Christmas Program is coming together. Songs are being selected, the script has been formatted into a film script, and now they begin casting. They will figure out filming times to have everything put together by December.
- e) **Family/Youth Director** – Nicholas reported: He is producing high school youth lessons for our youth group. He is also helping with confirmation lessons. Outside of church, he is attending football games.
- f) **Worship** – Jay Heil reported: They are planning Christmas Eve services and will be having three services – at 4:00pm, 6:00pm, and 8:00pm. They will be having a sign-up for each service to try to avoid overcrowding.
- g) **Evangelism/Outreach** – Martha reported: An ad was purchased in the “This Year’s Women in Business” section of the Yorktown News-View. Katie Serrano, our secretary, was spotlighted for her great work ethic and her shining attitude given to all of us here at St. Paul Lutheran.
- h) **Social Concerns** – Judy Taylor reported: They assisted one family with electricity this past month. They received a thank you note from YISD for the school supplies our church provided. There were 82 people in attendance at the flu vaccine clinic, which included 63 adults and 19 children.
- i) **Christian Life** – Cathy Moritz reported: They finished stuffing candy bags for drive-through trick-or-treating on Halloween. This will be held from 5:30-7:00pm. They have also planned a movie night for November 15<sup>th</sup>.
- j) **Property** – Michael reported: The following items have been worked on/addressed: Repaired toilet seat in men's restroom in the educational building; Fixed the board that was hanging down on the awning; Called the plumber to fix the drain pipe in TLG restroom, Fire extinguisher/stove

inspections are done; Called the electrician to switch out cut off system on the stove; Called sprinkler company to fix blown sprinkler head on playground; Tree Werks is finished with work for now. They will come back to finish the big oak tree when bees aren't as active as well as do work at the cemetery. Pastor has talked to a beekeeper, who is going to try to move the bees from the dead branch where they are located. Tree Werks is looking at ways to support the big oak tree in on the church property after a cable was broken.

k) **Cemetery** – Nothing to report.

l) **CEM** – No report.

m) **Pastor** – Professional activities during September 2020 included: 8 worship services, 4 home visits, 2 educational events, 3 church meetings and events, and 2 burials. He attended NALC Texas Region Pastors Retreat Sep 21-23.

## 5) **OLD BUSINESS**

a) **Stained Glass Windows Repair** – Clem reported everything is on schedule as of now. Work will be starting this month (October). Doris Koehler, Bill Klaevemann and Pastor took pictures of every single window. The pictures have been printed and we also have a digital copy. Each picture needs to be labeled before work begins.

### b) **Coronavirus**

1. **Sanitation** – Sprayer has arrived. Pastor used it with the chemical to disinfect. The chemical should last 90 days after a deep clean, or 30 days after a general cleaning. The buildings have all been sanitized.
2. **Sunday Service** – No new changes at this time.
3. **Saturday Service** – No new changes at this time
4. **Sunday School** – No new changes at this time.
5. **Youth** – No new changes at this time.
6. **Funerals** – Services can be held with 25% capacity.
7. **Weddings** – No new changes at this time.
8. **Other meetings and Functions** – No new changes at this time. Meetings are okay, but mingling events are not safe.
9. **Fellowship Hall Rentals** – We will continue to keep rentals on hold until further notice.

**10. Church Office** – No new changes at this time.

Hours are: Monday - Thursday 8:00am- 2:00pm, 1:00pm-4:30pm  
Friday 8:00am-12:00pm

c) **Nominations** – Every position has been filled.

d) **Committee Budgets** – No budget requests have been turned in.

**6) NEW BUSINESS**

a) **4-H Use of Fellowship Hall** – We are not opening up our Fellowship Hall for outside meetings at this time. The American Legion should be readily available soon. Clem will find out for sure after tonight.

b) **November Council Meeting Date** – Thursday, November 5, at 7:00pm. This meeting will be held as a GoTo Meeting.

c) **New Members** – Linda Hurta made a motion to accept Ryan and Debbie Riske as new members in our congregation. Michael Melanson seconded the motion. The motion passed.

**7) CLOSING** - The meeting closed with The Lord's Prayer.



Last month The Learning Garden celebrated their 7-year anniversary. Over the last 7 years we have overcome many obstacles and had many blessings. We have come a long way since 2013.

- The support and kindness from you the members of St. Paul Lutheran Church have been such a blessing. Thank you all for the support and kindness that you give to us.
- I love getting to know all the children and families that we have had or currently have. They are part of our TLG Family and always will be.
- We have 6 classrooms. Infants, Toddlers, Twos, Preschool, Prekindergarten, and After-School.
- We are a 4-Star Texas Rising Star Center.
- We are a Texas School Ready Participant (Preschool & PreK Rooms).
- We are using Frog Street Curriculum and Spark Activity Faith.
- HiMama Parent Reports that is all online to send parent reports and notifications has been especially useful.
- Tuition Express is used so parents can now pay online, or it be automatic drafted from their accounts.
- Shawn, Samantha, and Megan V. worked hard for their CDAs. (Child Development Associates Certifications)
- Currently Samantha, Megan V., and I are working on our Associates Degree in Child Development.

Now in 2020 we have been hit the COVID-19 obstacle. Before COVID we had over 60 children and dropped to around half of that. It was very scary for us all. Adding more measures to try to keep COVID out like taking temperatures of the staff, children, and families every morning. As well as monitoring temperatures throughout the day for staff and children. Wearing masks and feeling like we are having to shut everyone out.
