I borrowed the following from another Pastor, which I would like to share with you.

Sometimes it seems that time comes in little boxes. Each box is called a day. Approximately 30 boxes make a carton – called a month. A shipment of 12 cartons is called a year.

On January 1, many think they get a whole new shipment of 365 days. What a lot of time to have. How rich we are in time! But think a bit. Are you sure you received a full shipment? What if your subscription to time ran out during the year? What if you opened a carton and found empty boxes? No more time! No more time?

But you may have a full shipment this year. Maybe you have many shipments arriving in the future. Yet will you say, "I have no time"? That is a strange statement. People who say, "I have no time," always have time. Those who have no time are dead. The dead do not mention their lack of time. Only the living say, "I have no time."

We all have the same amount of time -24 hours a day. The

difference is in how we use our time. When we say we have no time for something; we mean that the "something" is not important enough for our time. We have to spend our time. It won't keep in a bank – not even with a lock on it. When you say you have no time to serve Christ; you are saying you would rather spend your time

another way. Of course, you don't want it to sound that way. You want to mean, "I'll give time to God later; when I have

more time." But are you sure you will have more time? What if your next shipment is only partially full?

- CALL TO ORDER The meeting of the Church Council of St. Paul Lutheran Church was called to order by Clem Waskow. Council members present for the meeting were Pastor Tim Muehlbrad, Clem Waskow, Linda Peyton, Linda Hurta, Calvin Bruns, Michael Melanson, Jay Heil, Hope Jendrzey, and Kristin Schustereit. Nicholas Lee was also in attendance.
- 2) **DEVOTION** The devotion was given by Jay Heil.
- 3) **MINUTES** The minutes from September 14, 2021, were approved as printed with no corrections.

4) REPORTS

- a) **Treasurer** The balance in the General Fund as of September 31, 2021, was \$170,018.17. The balance in the Building Fund was \$6,953.89. Calvin Bruns made a motion to accept the treasurer's report as printed. Jay Heil seconded the motion. The motion carried. Calvin also noted enough funds have been collected to cover 100% of the remaining cost of the window restoration project.
- b) **Stewardship** Nothing to report.
- c) **Parish Education** Linda Hurta reported: Attendance continues to be average for this time of year. The Mom's devotion time during Sunday School is going well. It meets in the basement. Plans

for the Christmas Children's program have been made. Once again it will be a video production. A program has been chosen, practice times have been scheduled, and a date has been set for the viewing of the video program.

- d) **Youth** There was nothing to add to the provided written report.
- e) **Family/Youth Director** Nicholas Lee and Linda Peyton reported:
 - 1. Inside the church: Wednesday Chapel for TLG; Holiday writing cards.
 - **2.** Outside the church: NALC District Youth Gathering planning.
- f) **Worship** Jay Heil reported: They are working on the 2022 song list. Christmas Eve services for this year are planned for 4:00 and 8:00pm.
- g) **Evangelism/Outreach** Hope Jendrzey reported: They have finalized two ads for the Yorktown News-View.
 - **1.** Congratulations to DeWitt County on 175th anniversary.
 - **2.** Salute to Katie Serrano, Rene Alvarez, and Jannette Stifflemire for the Women in Business section.

They have also completed an order for customized notepads, pens, and mugs for gifts for upcoming new members and to replenish our supply for future use. They are preparing for a cookie and coffee reception for the new members on Reformation Sunday, October 31st. The Fellowship Hall is reserved, so the small reception will be held on the patio in front of the church immediately following the service.

h) **Social Concerns** – Cindy Parma reported: Assistance was requested and provided with an electric bill.

- i) **Christian Life** No report.
- j) **Property** Michael reported the following as of October 12, 2021:
 - 1. Called Skip's Restaurant for the Fellowship Hall Stove pilot lights are not staying lit.
 - **2.** Starting the install of the fire alarm.
 - **3.** Breaker keeps tripping in gathering room at TLG. Rerouted the circuit.
 - **4.** A/C was squeaking in the basement. Called Gohmert Air, and he replaced a belt.
 - **5.** TLG called Buch Boyz Air Conditioning to fix the issues with A/C work.
 - **6.** Martin Plumbing fixed the ladies' restroom in the Sanctuary.
- k) **Cemetery** Nothing to report.
- 1) **CEM** Written report was provided.
- m) **Pastor** Professional activities during September 2021 included: 8 worship services, 7 home visits, 8 educational events, 6 church meetings and events, and 1 burial. Pastor added he will be out of the office October 19-21 for the Texas NALC Pastor's Retreat in Belton, TX.

5) OLD BUSINESS

- a) Covid Michael Melanson made a motion to remove the pew signs to make all pews available in the Sanctuary. Linda Hurta seconded the motion. The motion carried.
- b) Committee budget proposals due October 25th These will be presented at the November council meeting.

- b) Floor Maintenance Michael Melanson obtained an estimate for \$3,100 from Calvo's Janitorial Services to do maintenance on the floors in the Educational Building (clean, strip, wax, etc.). The work will be done in two days (Friday and Saturday). Michael Melanson made a motion for Calvo's Janitorial Services to conduct maintenance on the Educational Building floors for \$3,100.00, to be paid from the building fund. Jay Heil seconded the motion. The motion carried.
- 7) **CLOSING** Jay Heil made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Linda Hurta seconded the motion. The motion carried, and the meeting closed with The Lord's Prayer.



Because of all of your generosity, we have enough money to pay off the Stained Glass Windows Restoration! It has been a long process, but we

see the light at the end of the tunnel. By God's grace, the project should be completed by the end of the month. Special thanks goes to Bill Klaevemann for all of his hard work and dedication to oversee this project through completion.

It's a reminder to pray for and honor all who serve and sacrifice, to support and assist their families, and to pray that God will bring peace on earth.





Thank Offering Service

The Women of the Church will lead the Annual ThankOffering service on November 21, 2021. We are asking each of you to give a special ThankOffering in response to God's blessings that you have received.

This year, all funds received will be divided between the NALC Disaster Response Fund and YAM. Disaster Response has been busy responding to the needs of the people affected by the West Coast wildfires, flooding in

Tennessee, the freeze in Texas, and most recently, Hurricane Ida in Louisiana. In fact, the warehouse in Rosenberg, Texas is now empty with the last of the supplies going to Louisiana. This fund depends on donations from NALC Congregations in order to operate. YAM, our local food pantry, provides food to over 150 families per month, which so far this year, amounts to over 86,000 lbs of food at a cost of \$16,400.00.

Let us be aware of our brothers and sisters in Christ who are in need of basic items to survive. You may use one of the pew envelopes, write a check and designate, "for ThankOffering" to be taken on November 21, 2021. You may also take your offering to the Church office at any time.


