

But, we will also celebrate as the living saints of this earth as we receive assurance of the forgiveness of sins in receiving Holy Communion.

The church of both Saints (those washed in baptism with the promise of forgiveness) and of sinners (those who need to continually hear the promise of forgiveness) continues. We celebrate All Saints Sunday with a remembrance of the past in our prayers, by partaking of Holy Communion in the present, and by hearing the promises of what is yet to come.

CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING ST. PAUL LUTHERAN CHURCH October 14, 2025 @ 6 PM

1. CALL TO ORDER- The meeting of the Church Council of St. Paul Lutheran Church was called to order by Boyd Weise, President. Council members present for the meeting were Boyd Weise, Wade Bolting, Laurey Garcia, Larry Gohmert, Jay Heil, Pam Hoefling, Ashleigh Peyton, Susan Franke, and Pastor

- Tim Muehlbrad. Terry Carmichael and Amanda Rodriguez were also in attendance.
- 2. **DEVOTION-** Jay Heil opened the meeting with prayer.
- 3. **MINUTES-** Jay Heil made a motion to accept the September 9, 2025, minutes as presented. Pam Hoefling seconded the motion. The motion carried.

4. REPORTS-

- a. **Treasurer/Stewardship-** Calvin Bruns provided a written report.
- b. Parish Education- Jill Turner reported:
 - 1. I spoke with Sunday school teachers about the new curriculum, and there were mixed reports on how it has been going. The nursery said their curriculum was going well. The youth Sunday school teachers were mixed, with some saying it was going well, and others saying that it was more time-consuming to prepare the lessons than before.
 - 2. Terry is working on summer camp for youth and Confirmation kids. The fees have gone up significantly.
 - 3. We are looking for someone to head the Christmas program for this year. Zoe is unable to lead the program this year.
- c. **Youth Committee Report-** Laurey Garcia reported:
 - 1. The Grandparent's Day Celebration was enjoyed by all who attended. The youth did a wonderful job hosting and serving their grandparents!
 - 2. We have planned a day at the J Welch Farms Corn Maze on Saturday, October 25, 2025,

- @ 6 PM. There are sign-up sheets with price information in the basement and at both entrances of the church.
- 3. I have rescheduled our youth workday to Sunday, October 26, 2025, after the potluck meal. We will meet in the basement and then begin our project.
- 4. Our next committee meeting will be on Tuesday, October 28, 2025, @ 6 PM.

d. DCE- Terry Carmichael reported:

- 1. Besides the normal duties (Childcare Chapels, Sunday School, and other duties), the following were accomplished:
 - a. Have been teaching the final summer classes on Sundays when there were no teachers who signed up to take the lessons.
 - b. Have been providing elementary Sunday school teachers with downloading and then copying their new curriculum materials for the month and placing them in their binders in their classrooms. This also included purchasing and installing a new color inkjet printer in the Sunday school supply room for teachers to make copies of the new curriculum if needed.
 - c. Ordered and provided booklets for the new preschool and kindergarten Sunday school curriculum for those classes.
 - d. Played guitars with PT and Friends at services on 9/27 and 9/28.
 - e. Assisted Pastor with teaching the Confirmation classes.
 - f. Led the Saturday, Sept. 14th Worship Service with assistance from Jay Heil and

- gave the sermon to allow Pastor to attend the Oromo church building's dedication held that day.
- g. Attended the "See You at the Pole" student-led prayer event at the high school.
- h. Will be assisting Pastor with guitar classes on Wed. evenings.
- i. Attended several volleyball games and football games in-town and out-of-town.
- j. Have been working with the Bible Presentation to 2nd graders on 10/26.

e. Worship- Jay Heil reported:

- 1. Acolyte training is scheduled for November 2nd for ages 3rd grade and older.
- 2. Jay will get with Mary Ressmann and Amanda about poinsettias for the church for Christmas.
- f. **Evangelism/Outreach-** Wade Bolting reported:
 - 1. I mailed out 1 visitor card this month.
 - 2. I bought 50 postcards to pass out to Western Days Parade participants.
 - 3. I'm working on a St. Paul Lutheran Church card to pass out for Western Days.

g. Social Concerns- Susan Franke reported:

- 1. Assistance was provided to 4 individuals in August 2025.
 - a. Provided help for two individuals with water bill (\$179.16)
 - b. Provided help for two individuals with electric bill (\$200.00)

h. Christian Life- Pam Hoefling reported:

- 1. We had a potluck on September 21st. We had about 40 people in attendance.
- i. Property- Larry Gohmert Reported:
 - 1. M.E. Plumbing is completing its replacement of the plumbing in the Educational Building. The company has been a pleasure to work with.
 - 2. Schroeder Air Conditioning was unable to get our church air conditioning unit replaced during September, but they are actively working on it now. They have the inside and outside equipment on hand and are fabricating the necessary ductwork. Installation should happen in the next couple of weeks.
 - 3. The elevator is out of service again. The company that is currently our maintenance provider has been contacted.
 - 4. I have received a quote from a different maintenance company, Ameritex Elevator Services, and given the ongoing problems we have been experiencing, I believe we should give them a try. I am still investigating what the procedure would be to change elevator maintenance contracts.
 - 5. The roof problems on top of the bell tower of the church have been replaced.

In the meeting discussion it was mentioned that a rock was found by the technician in the track of the elevator which caused the latest shutdown. The elevator is now in operating condition.

Boyd Weise will send out a reminder email to the Performance Review Committee to evaluate employee performance for the year before the Budget Committee Meeting. The Budget Committee is set to meet on November 21st to set the budget for 2026.
- b. The creation of a Youth Representative position on our council was discussed. Larry Gohmert made a motion to create a Youth Representative position to begin after the Congregational

- Meeting in January 2026, and Laurey Garcia seconded the motion. The motion carried.
- c. Boyd Weise contacted the Endowment Committee for clarification on the committee's process, intent, vision, and scope to be reviewed by a lawyer to ensure legality.
- 7. **CLOSING-** Jay Heil made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Ashleigh Peyton seconded the motion. The motion carried, and the meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.




