It was October 31, 1517 (505 years ago) that Martin Luther posted 95 statements for discussion on the door of the Wittenberg Castle Church on the evening before All Saints Day. The event started the Protestant Reformation and the Lutheran Church.

Also, on October 30th this year, we will be celebrating the 150th Anniversary of our own congregation. The day will be filled with worship, a congregational photo, a catered meal, a program, a display of historical items, photos and videos, and time to visit. In celebration of our 150th Anniversary, we have been working on a mission project to support the Oromo Lutheran Church in

Houston as they continue to grow and work to have their own place of worship. With our help, they have been able to pay off their debt on purchased land and to proceed with plans for building a Sanctuary and educational space. We have met and exceeded our goal of \$1,000 for every year of our existence -- \$150,000, and there is still time to participate in this mission project if you have not yet done so.



The Reformation was a return to the truth of God's Word and the proclamation of the kingdom of God for all people. As we continue as a congregation, and hopefully celebrate many more anniversaries, we remember what we were commissioned to do: "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations."

CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

ST. PAUL LUTHERAN CHURCH

September 13, 2022 – 7:00pm

- CALL TO ORDER The meeting of the Church Council of St. Paul Lutheran Church was called to order by Clem Waskow. Council members present for the meeting were Pastor Tim Muehlbrad, Clem Waskow, Bill Klaevemann, Linda Peyton, Hope Jendrzey, Cathy Moritz, Pam Hoefling, Tina Boehm, and Kristin Schustereit. Katie Serrano was also in attendance.
- 2) **DEVOTION** Pam Hoefling gave the devotion.
- 3) **MINUTES** The minutes from August 9, 2022, were approved as printed with no corrections.
- 4) **REPORTS**
 - a) **Treasurer/Stewardship** Cindy Parma made a motion to approve the Treasurer's Report as presented. Bill Klaevemann seconded. The motion

carried.

- b) **Parish Education** No report.
- c) Youth Linda Peyton reported:
 - 1. The youth has started a money wall fundraiser to raise money for camp. As of today, \$5,227.00 has been collected.
 - 2. Zoe Innocenti has volunteered to lead the Christmas Program. The junior high and high school students will be assisting her. The Christmas Program will be held on Sunday, December 18, 2022.
 - **3.** A special meeting was held on September 6, 2022, to discuss the job description for a new youth director. The new title of this job will be Director of Christian Education. The job description will be presented to the council.
 - **4.** Our monthly gathering with the youth was a painting party. The youth painted crosses on canvases to be displayed during the 150th anniversary celebration. 27 youth attended. Our next gathering is pending for October.
 - **5.** The next youth committee meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, September 27, 2022, at 6:00pm.
 - 6. Laurey Garcia joined the youth committee.
- d) Worship No report.
- e) Evangelism/Outreach Hope Jendrzey reported: They attended the Yorktown Community Back to School Bash in the park. They handed out popcorn and pencil bags filled with pencils and notepads. Pastor, Linda Peyton, Penny Sievers, and Kendall Sievers helped make this a successful event. Hope also worked with the Yorktown News View on several ads – Dewitt County Visitors Guide; 2022 Fall Sports Preview Section; and 2022 Women in Business Special Section.
- f) Social Concerns Cathy Moritz reported:

Assistance was provided to six individuals in August 2022 - \$344.21 for water bills; \$100 for a utility bill; and \$100 for a hotel room and gas.

- g) Christian Life Pam Hoefling reported: On August 28, 2022, Christian Life hosted three celebrations-inone. The annual Rally Day hamburger meal, Pastor Tim Muehlbrad's 35th Ordination Anniversary, and Nichols Lee's Farewell was held. A sign-up list was posted with 79 people signing up, and we had approximately 100 eating. Along with burgers, hot dogs, and fixings, we served two decorated cakes, one for each honoree. Our next event will be a potluck on September 18, 2022. Please join us for good food and fellowship!
- h) **Property** Bill Klaevemann reported the following as of September 2022:
 - **1.** Installed new door closer on door leading to the Learning Garden playground.
 - 2. Youth room in church basement has been redone. Huge thank you to Laurey Garcia for the work and effort for a job well done.
 - 3. Cleanup and refreshing of parsonage #2 have begun. A garage sale is planned to dispose of items left behind. Thanks to Luellen Smiley and Dorothy Mayfield for helping to get this accomplished.
 - **4.** Church and Learning Garden mailboxes have been installed. Thanks to Clem and Katie for their help in getting this done.
- i) Cemetery Kristin Schustereit reported: The cemetery mapping is now live. A flyer with a QR code was provided for members to see the digital mapping. There are errors that will be corrected over time, but these will be discovered along the way. A write-up will be placed in the newsletter for church members.

- j) **CEM** Written report was provided.
- k) Pastor
 - Professional activities during August 2022 included: 9 worship services, 4 hospital visits, 12 home visits, 9 educational events, 8 church meetings and events, 1 professional meeting, and 1 community event. Official acts during August included two burials.
- 5) OLD BUSINESS
 - a) Parish Ed Council Position Rebecca Innocenti will be working in the Sunday School department. Bill Klaevemann made a motion to appoint Tina Boehm as the Church Council representative for Parish Education. Pam Hoefling seconded the motion. The motion carried.
 - b) Generator Project Bill Klaevemann has obtained bids from Coastal Bend Power Services: \$131,846.41 for a 200 KW generator and \$131,630.11 for a 180 KW. It is important for us to obtain a generator for emergencies, as we are an American Red Cross Evacuation Center. The bids received expire after 15 days. Bill will obtain additional bids by our next meeting to get a pricing baseline for our Annual Congregational Meeting.
- 6) NEW BUSINESS
 - a) Western Days Fellowship Hall Pam Hoefling made a motion to make our Educational Building available to use during the Western Days Parade. Bill Klaevemann seconded the motion. The motion carried.
 - b) Update Edward Jones Weischwill account signatures – Pam Hoefling made a motion to approve John Frels, Pamela Weise, Dorothy Mayfield, Bill Klaevemann, Catherine Serrano, and Cindy Parma as authorized signers on the Edward Jones Weischwill account. Hope Jendrzey seconded the motion. The

motion carried.

- c) Job description for Director of Christian
 Education Bill Klaevemann made a motion to accept the job description for the Director of Christian
 Education as presented. Pam Hoefling seconded the motion. The motion carried.
- d) Compensation Package Committee for the Director of Christian Education – Cindy Parma made a motion for Cathy Moritz, Linda Peyton, Clem Waskow, Bill Klaevemann, Cindy Parma, and Pastor Tim Muehlbrad to serve on the Compensation Package Committee for the director of Christian Education. Linda Peyton seconded the motion. The motion carried. They will meet on Wednesday, September 28th, at 5:00pm.
- CLOSING Cindy Parma made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Bill Klaevemann seconded the motion. The motion carried, and the meeting closed with The Lord's Prayer.
