Most people know of October 31 as Halloween, but it is also an important date in the Protestant Churches and particularly in the Lutheran Church. It was October 31, 1517 that Martin Luther posted 95 statements for discussion on the door of the Castle Church on the evening before All Saints Day. The event started the Protestant Reformation.

But how well do you know the historical roots of our church? What do you know about Martin Luther? Give yourself this little quiz and then check the answers at the end of the article.

NALC Continental Youth Gathering Coming!

The North American Lutheran Church (NALC), which is our governing church body, will be holding a special, major, first-time youth event this coming July 1st through 4th, 2024 in Boerne TX. This event will be for youth ages 12-18 yrs. old from across the country! The main information (and maybe the registration as well) will be arriving this month sometime.

Youth who are age 19-25 may, also, participate as, "Leaders In Training," who will volunteer to assist with the event and some of the activities by working those portions of the event. You would be required to do some Zoom training but when you are not working you will be able to participate in the event like all others.

These types of events can be tremendous opportunities to meet youth from across the nation, experience fantastic worship services (as you will be worshipping with hundreds of others), a chance to possibly do a service project to help others, a chance to see and be a “tourist” while there, and just have a chance to have fun and get to know your own youth members better.

Since we do not know how many they will be accepting, and what the final details are, we want to be ready when the info does come. So, we are placing a sign-up sheet in the basement. We do know that they require one adult at least 25 yrs old or older for each 7 registered youth. Depending on how many youth sign up we may need adult help as well. We will want to register as quickly as we can when the registration opens as, being the first event, we don’t know how fast it might fill up. We really hope you will consider going to this special event!

NOTE: There will be things we will need to do as a group before this event such as planning, fund raising, and needed activities and/or documents. There is an old saying about these events that holds true: for every hour you prepare at home it equates to three hours of a pleasant experience there. Sometimes these hours can be just as special as those at the event!

CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

ST. PAUL LUTHERAN CHURCH

September 12, 2023 – 6:00pm

- 1) **CALL TO ORDER** The meeting of the Church Council of St. Paul Lutheran Church was called to order by Boyd Weise, president. Council members present for the meeting were

Boyd Weise, Calvin Bruns, Tina Boehm, Linda Peyton, Terry Carmichael, Jay Heil, Hope Jendrzey, Cathy Moritz, Pam Hoefling, Larry Gohmert, Kristin Schustereit, and Pastor Tim Muehlbrad. Katie Serrano was also in attendance.

- 2) **DEVOTION** Cathy Moritz provided the devotion.
- 3) **MINUTES** Jay Heil made a motion to accept the August 15, 2023, minutes as presented. Hope Jendrzey seconded the motion. The motion carried.

4) **REPORTS**

- a) **Treasurer/Stewardship** – Calvin Bruns had no additions to his report provided.
- b) **Parish Education** – Rebecca Innocenti provided a written report: Summer Sunday school has been well attended. Spark curriculum for the fall has been ordered. Rally Day will be held on September 10, 2023. During the worship service, the children will sing, and teachers and other Sunday school volunteers will be installed. Students will be promoted during the Sunday school hour at the Fellowship Hall where skits and activities will take place. The Christmas program has been chosen; Details will be announced in the newsletter.
- c) **Youth** – Linda Peyton reported:
 1. On September 6, 2023, the FFF youth baked cookies for grandparent's day to be handed out on grandparent's day weekend (September 9 and 10).
 2. Rally Day is set for September 10, 2023
 3. We will be holding a pumpkin decorating contest on Sunday, October 15, 2023, from 2:00 to 4:00pm.
 4. Our next youth committee meeting will be held on Tuesday, September 26, 2023, at 6:00pm.
- d) **D.C.E.** – Terry Carmichael reported:
 1. Have begun the school year schedule of Childcare Chapels. I am working with them on providing offering artwork on the bible themes each week to share with the congregation and possibly the nursing home. (Note: this may be a few weeks in the making as they are having their floors re-done and they do not have total access to their rooms or materials)
 2. Currently working on and finalizing plans for Rally

- Day Sept. 10. Have arranged with 6 of the youth to be Bible Characters for the children to meet as they walk around the campus here. We will also have bible-based games for them to enjoy.
3. Met with the Sunday school teachers and Parish Ed committee on Aug. 20.
 4. Planned and led the Youth Committee meeting on August 29.
 5. Have been assisting teachers of Summer Sunday School as needed with materials and other needs.
 6. Planned and led the Children's Sermons on August 27 and Sept. 10.
 7. Researched and developed a plan and maps for emergencies such as fire, severe weather, and dangerous intruder for the Sunday School and Nursery. The map includes the panic button locations in the basement and the church. They will be kept in a folder in the Sunday School and Nursery rooms, so they are readily accessible for the teachers, but not in plain sight for an intruder.
 8. Have been in contact with the Yorktown Nursing Home about a possible youth service project there for Christmas.
 9. Will meet with the Sr. High study group during Sunday School in the chapel.
 10. Have begun meeting with the FFF group on Wed. evenings again.
 11. Have been assisting Pastor with the upcoming Confirmation schedule.
 12. Will be assisting the VBS and camp groups to sing a song during the Sunday worship service of Rally Day.
 13. Attended the following:
 - Varsity Football game on 9/1
 - Jr. High Volleyball game on 8/28
 - High School Volleyball game on 9/5
 14. As you read this, we will finally be in the middle of saying the final goodbye to my brother Tom. His memorial Service will be Friday, Sept. 8 in San Antonio at Concordia Lutheran Church and the

Military Honors burial will be at Ft. Sam Cemetery on Sept 12. I want to thank you from myself, Susan, and the family for all the prayers, condolences, cards, and memorials in his name from the members of the church. They are very much appreciated.

15. Thank you to Christian Life, music providers, and all others involved in helping make Rally Day successful.

- e) **Worship** – Nothing to report.
- f) **Evangelism/Outreach** – Hope Jendrzey reported: There will be a new member Sunday on October 29, 2023, with 10 new members joining.
- g) **Social Concerns** – Cathy Moritz reported:
 - 1. Assistance was provided to three individuals in August 2023
 - a) Provided \$100 for water bill.
 - b) Provided \$100 for water bill.

- h) **Christian Life** – Pam Hoefling reported: A church potluck was held August 20, 2023. Approximately 50 people attended and brought dishes shared by all attending. We were asked for the use of our Fellowship Hall for Regan Saunders’ funeral reception. Members who are able to bring dessert are encouraged to bring them to the hall by 10:00am on Saturday, September 16th.
- i) **Property** – Larry Gohmert reported the following as of September 12, 2023:
 - 1. An electrician from Coastal Bend Power who was troubleshooting power to the lighted cross on top of the bell tower reported to me that he couldn’t open the “hatch cover” at the top of the last ladder, leading up to the base of the cross. I’m planning to fly my drone up there to take a look.
 - 2. Jung Tile has been working on replacing the floor tile in the Learning Garden rooms. The process has not gone as smoothly as we had hoped. As I write this on Wednesday, September 6, there are issues with uneven tiles, as well as edge trim that is already coming off the wall. Also, they ran short of materials and won’t have the rest until September 19 according to their most

recent estimate. The Learning Garden folks have been very understanding about the whole process.

3. I want to thank Todd Metting for doing a short notice trimming of the bottom of some of the doors in the Learning Garden rooms when it was realized that the new flooring caused some of the doors to drag.
4. The washing machine at Parsonage 2 has been replaced.
5. A ceiling fan at Parsonage 2 isn't fanning any more. Replacing it is in progress.
6. Our lawn mowing contractor, Jerry Fuentes, has pointed out to me a couple of sprinkler heads that aren't functioning. Thanks to Bill Klaevemann and Katie for knowing who to call to start the repair process.
7. Our audio streaming security certificate is out. I am having trouble getting it fixed but am working on it.

j) **Cemetery** – Nothing to report.

k) **CEM** – A written report was provided.

a) **Pastor** – Professional activities during August 2023 included: 7 worship services, 4 hospital visits, 11 home visits, 3 educational events, 8 church meetings and events, and 1 community event. He also attended the Theological Conference and NALC Convocation in Oklahoma City, OK. Official acts in August included 3 burials and 1 baptism.

5) **OLD BUSINESS**

a) **Fellowship Hall Caretaker** – A couple of volunteers have come forward to be on the committee, including Carlea Hahn and Pam Hoefling, but no one has stepped up to be the chairperson. Boyd will again ask the congregation for volunteers in church.

6) **NEW BUSINESS**

a) **Youth Space** – We have a lot of youth coming up and not enough room for them. We are looking at current space, possible places for expansion, options, etc. A task force will need to be set up to handle this project. Katie will include a message in the newsletter. The task force will meet at 6:00pm in the meeting room on September 28,

2023.

- b) **2024 Budget** – Budget requests need to be submitted by the October 17 council meeting. There will be a budget committee meeting at 5:00pm on October 26, 2023.
 - c) **Oromo Camp Sponsorship** – Pastor and the confirmation parents had an idea to sponsor the confirmation aged-children from the Oromo congregation to attend church camp with us next summer. Fundraisers would need to be held. Ideas are just getting started.
 - d) **Electronic Newspaper** – Jay Heil volunteered to purchase an online subscription for \$42 for two years to the Yorktown News-View for Jairus Herring.
- 7) **CLOSING** – Jay Heil made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Pam Hoebling seconded the motion. The motion carried, and the meeting closed with The Lord's Prayer.

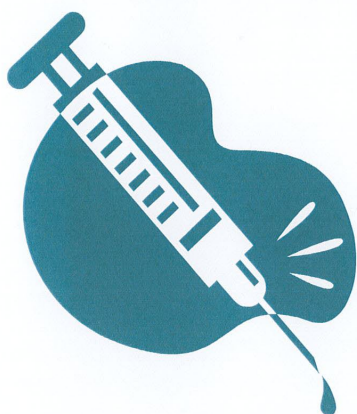
