
Bishop Desmond Tutu was an Anglican Bishop and General Secretary

of the South African Council of Churches. Working against the apartheid system in South Africa, Bishop Tutu was constantly under threat of imprisonment, torture and death. In the midst of his experiences Bishop Tutu wrote these words which not only helped him and the Church then, but also speaks to us today. He says:

- "People are unreasonable, illogical and self-centered. Love them anyway!
- If you do good, people will accuse you of selfish ulterior motives. Do good anyway!
- The good you do today will be forgotten tomorrow. Do good anyway!
- Honesty and frankness make you vulnerable. Be honest and frank anyway!
- The biggest people with the biggest ideas can be shot down by the smallest people with the smallest minds. Think big anyway!
- What you spend years building may be destroyed overnight. Build anyway!
- People really need help but may attack you if you help them. Help people anyway!
- Give the world the best you have and you'll get kicked in the teeth. Give the world the best you've got anyway!"

These words are as true for us as they were for Bishop Tutu -- as necessary today as they were then. Love, do good, be frank and honest, think big, build, help people, and give the best you've got anyway!

President. Council members present for the meeting were Boyd Weise, Calvin Bruns, Larry Gohmert, Laurey Garcia, Wade Bolting, Susan Franke, Ashleigh Peyton, and Pastor Tim Muehlbrad.

- 2. **DEVOTION-** Susan Franke provided the devotion.
- 3. **MINUTES-** Laurey Garcia made a motion to accept the August 13, 2024, minutes as presented. Wade Bolting seconded the motion. The motion carried.

4. REPORTS-

- a. **Treasurer/Stewardship-** Calvin Bruns provided a written report.
- b. Parish Education-No report provided.
- c. Youth Committee Report- Laurey Garcia reported:
 - 1. The pool party had approximately 60 adults and children that attended. Everyone seemed to have a great time and enjoyed the pool and the pizza. Terry did the devotion, and all the kids who attended camp led us in the blessing.
 - 2. We started FFF on Wednesday, August 21st and had 17 kids! We had a great night!
 - 3. Wednesday, September 4th, the FFF youth met in the fellowship hall, baked, and bagged cookies to hand out at church on Saturday, 9/7 and Sunday, 9/8 for Grandparent's Day. We had 15 youth attend and all enjoyed baking, bagging, and especially the eating of the cookies that "broke." LOL.
 - 4. We are having a Paint & Praise event hosted by Nancy Beeson in the Fellowship Hall on Saturday, September 21, 2021, from 2-4 PM. The cost will be \$35.00. There are flyers with all the information for sign up throughout the church, basement, and fellowship hall. As of right now, we have 12 people signed up. The activity will be moved to the basement.

- 14. Thank you, Pastor, for leading the Blessing of the Backpacks and the Teacher Installation at the Rally Day Worship Service.

15. Other:

- a. Attended several junior high and high school volleyball games
- b. Attended the first home football game
- c. Several Learning Garden meetings on Summer and next year's chapel schedule.
- d. Several office meetings on Sunday School and one on pictures for the directory.
- e. Worship- No report provided.
- f. Evangelism/Outreach- Wade Bolting reported:
 - 1. We purchased a \$600 Wildcat Sponsorship from the Yorktown Athletic Booster Club. That sponsorship includes:
 - a. 2-3x5 banners: 1 displayed at Wildcat Stadium and 1 displayed at the Kittycat softball field
 - b. Our name on a big banner to be displayed in the gym
 - c. Outdoor flag for residence or businesses
 - d. Our name and level announced at all home games for the year
 - e. 12 free passes to be used at any home sporting event for the year
 - f. 2 Wildcat caps

- 2. We also purchased an advertisement for the Yorktown News View Sports Poster.
- 3. Purchased Christian pumpkin story books, scripture candy, Religious Harvest Lollipops, and plastic Christian pumpkin drawstring goody bags to hand to the kids at Trunk-or-Treat. Total cost is \$242.77.

g. Social Concerns- Susan Franke reported:

- 1. Assistance was provided to 7 individuals in August:
 - a. Provided help \$300.00 for water bill
 - b. Provided help \$100.00 for electric bill
 - c. Provided help \$255.36 for hotel bill
 - d. Provided help \$61.15 for food and gas.

h. Christian Life-Pam Hoefling reported:

1. On August 11, 2024, we held a Deluxe Nacho Bar. Approximately 50 people were served.

i. Property-Larry Gohmert reported:

- 1. We are literally inches away from completion of the backup generator for the Educational Building. Inches of water column, that is. While working through their startup checklist, Coastal Bend Power found that the gas pressure being delivered to the generator is 2 inches of water column too low. They are waiting for the plumber to come adjust or replace the low-pressure regulator. (28 inches of water column= 1 psi).
- 2. A hole in the playground that was reported by Jerry Fuentes during his lawn mowing has been filled.
- 3. The kitchen range and microwave at Parsonage 2 have been replaced with matching new appliances.
- 4. We are looking into inadequate cooling of Terry's office during hot summer days. Bruce "Moon" Gohmert has made some suggestions.
- 5. Since the flooring in the church offices will soon be replaced thanks to a generous gift, we are securing bids on also painting the offices to give everything a fresh look.

- 6. We are in the bidding process for replacement flooring in the Meeting Room.
- 7. Another lamp post in front of the Church broke off at ground level recently. The post itself is standing again, and the globe on top will be replaced shortly.
- 8. The outside air conditioning unit for the 3-year-old room at the Learning Garden has been replaced. They have also reported what appears to be mold around the ceiling air conditioning registers in the preschool classroom and possible rodent damage to some insulation. This is being investigated.
- 9. Katie's office computer has been occasionally uncooperative lately. I have a replacement power supply ordered for it. Also, I will be installing some new networking equipment when the office furniture is moved back into place after the new flooring has been installed.
- 10. It may soon be time to start replacing some of the pecan trees if we wish to continue to enjoy the shade. We have lost a number of them in recent years.

- b. 2025 Budget- Deadline October 8, 2024- Committee budget requests will need to be turned in on the next Church Council meeting date.
- c. Annual Congregational Meeting Date- A motion was made by Wade Bolting to schedule the Annual Congregational Meeting for January 26, 2025. Calvin Bruns seconded the motion. The motion carried.
- d. Laurey Garcia made a motion to allow the Western Days Committee (if they ask the church) to use our Fellowship Hall facilities at no cost during Western Days Parade. Wade Bolting seconded the motion. The motion carried.
- 7. **CLOSING-** Laurey Garcia made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Ashleigh Peyton seconded the motion. The motion carried, and the meeting closed with The Lord's Prayer.


