What causes people to choose a particular congregation when they decide to join a church? In my reading I came across a couple of surveys. Here are the results of a survey done in the Houston area:

Why Do People Join a Particular Congregation?

- 3% Pastor in the pulpit.
- 8% Architectural beauty of the building.
- 12% Prior denominational affiliation.
- 18% Convenience of location.
- 20% Influenced by the fact that there were people in the congregation whom they respected.
- 39% Because their friends and neighbors invited them. (In a national poll 9% joined because of the minister and 44% joined because they were invited by a member.)

The figures really show the importance of the ministry of each member for the growth and wellbeing of a congregation.

Please Note:

You are 12 times more important in getting people to come to church by your invitation than the sermon!

Your witness of a Christian Life is 6 times more important than the sermon!

Are we guilty of relying on our least effective means (the Pastor) and ignoring our most effective outreach resources (the members of our congregation)? How many guests have you invited and brought to worship this year?

You and your invitation and witness are very important in the outreach of the Gospel!

August 9, 2022 - 7:00pm

- 1) CALL TO ORDER The meeting of the Church Council of St. Paul Lutheran Church was called to order by Clem Waskow. Council members present for the meeting were Pastor Tim Muehlbrad, Clem Waskow, Boyd Weise, Bill Klaevemann, Linda Peyton, Hope Jendrzey, Cathy Moritz, Nicholas Lee, and Kristin Schustereit. Katie Serrano was also in attendance.
- 2) **DEVOTION** Cathy Moritz gave the devotion.
- 3) **MINUTES** The minutes from July 12, 2022, were approved as printed with no corrections.
- 4) REPORTS
 - a) **Treasurer/Stewardship** The Treasurer's Report was reviewed.
 - b) Parish Education No report.
 - c) Youth Linda Peyton reported:
 - 1. Inside church: VBS 2022 Running groups; Summer Camp 2022 (Confirmation); Parent meeting for Family & Youth Parents helped plan the Fall 2022 schedule. Plans were made until February 2023. A schedule will be sent out in a letter to parents; Two fundraiser events were planned by parents at the July meeting: Cash Envelope Fund and Superbowl LXVI Fundraiser. All proceeds are to going towards summer camp 2023.
 - 2. Outside church: Helped at YAM in July.

- d) Family/Youth Director Nicholas had no additions.
- e) Worship Boyd Weise reported: Rally Day is set for August 28th. A VBS video will be presented. We will be borrowing risers from Yorktown ISD for the congregational picture. He will be meeting soon with Ressman's Nursery about Poinsettias.
- f) Evangelism/Outreach Hope Jendrzey reported: An ad was placed in the Yorktown News-View for the 2022 DeWitt County Visitor's Guide and the 2022 Yorktown Football poster. An ad was purchased to support the Yorktown High School Cheerleaders' program.
- g) **Social Concerns** Cathy Moritz reported: Assistance was provided to three individuals in July 2022 \$80 for an electricity bill; \$77.71 for a water bill; and \$100 to assist with an electricity bill.
- h) Christian Life Pam Hoefling provided a written report: On July 24th, a taco meal was hosted, consisting of crispy tacos, nachos, refried beans, nacho cheese, and avocado green sauce. Approximately 48 people were in attendance. The next event scheduled is Rally day on August 28th. Robin and Clay Caran have graciously donated the meat for the hamburgers on Rally Day.
- i) **Property** Bill Klaevemann reported the following as of August 2022:
 - 1. Unclogged drain line on AC unit in the church.
 - 2. Toilet repaired for The Learning Garden classroom.
 - **3.** Unclogged drain line on the refrigerator.
 - **4.** Assembling post for mailboxes (Church and The Learning Garden).
 - **5.** A-1, Triple D and the Fire Marshall approved the fire alarm system.
- j) Cemetery Kristin Schustereit reported: All the digital mapping is almost complete for the cemetery digitizing project. The next step will be approval of the digital maps and training of the software, which should take about an hour.
- k) **CEM** Written report was provided.
- 1) Pastor
 - 1. Professional activities during July 2022 included: 10

- worship services, 1 hospital visit, 7 home visits, 8 educational events, 10 church meetings and events, 1 professional meeting, and 1 week of Vacation Bible School.
- 2. The Southwestern Tx. Mission District Convocation was held via zoom on July 9. Pastor Ralph Reitmeyer is the new Dean of our Mission District.
- **3.** Term limits were changed to align with each other so that all leaders can be chosen at the Convocation.
- **4.** NALC Convocation was held via Zoom meeting on August 5th. Elections were held, and the budget was passed for 2023.

5) OLD BUSINESS

- a) Parish Education Council Position No updates.
- b) **Mailbox** The mailboxes have been assembled, and they just need to be installed. The church will be Suite A, The Learning Garden will be Suite B.
- c) Generator Project Coastal Bend Electric is still waiting to meet with AEP.
- d) **Cemetery Records** After Kristin's approval of the digital maps, she and Boyd Weise will attend a training. The project is almost complete as far as getting set up.

6) **NEW BUSINESS**

- a) Pastor Vacation: October 31 November 6, 2022 & December 26 January 8, 2023. Bill Klaevemann made a motion to accept Pastor's requests for vacation for October 31 through November 6, 2022, as well as December 26 through January 8, 2023. Boyd Weise seconded the motion. The motion carried.
- b) Nicholas' Resignation Bill Klaevemann made a motion to accept Nicholas Lee's resignation, effective August 31, 2022. Linda Peyton seconded. The motion carried.
- 7) **CLOSING** Boyd Weise made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Bill Klaevemann seconded the motion. The motion carried, and the meeting closed with The Lord's Prayer.





Play, Learn, & Grow Summer Festival:

Thank you to everyone that came out to our Festival on July 30, 2022. There was a total of 5 organizations that came out to give resources to families and guests. Those organizations included the DeWitt-Lavaca Special Education Cooperative, Region 3 ECI, Mid-Coast Family Services, Maximus, Inc., & The Cuero-DeWitt County Health Department. 
