A New Sunday School Curriculum!

Due to a change in the use of versions of the bible for our current curriculum choice, we will be changing our Sunday School curriculum for the coming year. We will be switching to curriculum from the SOLA Publishing Company which affiliates itself with the LCMC (Lutheran Churches in Mission for Christ). The Preschool will be using the "All God's Critters" curriculum which covers Bible Stories that have animals in them. The Elementary classes will be using SEED (Sola Electronic Education Database). It will cover stories throughout the year from the bible in stories from Genesis to Revelation.

SOLA follows the ESV version (English Standard Version) of the bible which is considered a highly accurate translation to the original language of biblical texts.

We are looking forward to an exciting year with this curriculum and we look forward to sharing and enjoying the stories of the bible with the children!

A Brief Note on Pittsburgh

The Lutheran Week in Pittsburgh for the NALC was a good event. The Theological Conference concerned itself with, "How to be the Church in today's society". It had some interesting insights. Look for some of those insights next month!

NALC National Youth Gathering News!

One piece of information that came out of Pittsburgh was further information on the National Youth Gathering next Summer July 7-10 in Roanoke, Virginia. Some of it was a surprise as they are opening registration sometime in October (no specific date to start has been given yet) and it will end April 15th OR until full. Note the OR in that last sentence. They only have a 350 person capacity and the location for this year places it within an area with many NALC churches and many large ones. They feel it will fill up quickly. (To give you an idea the attendance at the first Gathering in Boerne had 300 there) It is for youth 12-18 years of age. Another twist this year is that each group will be responsible for finding their own accommodations for the stay (hotels, etc.).

We know everyone's schedule can be busy that time of year. But, as you can see we really need to have our registrations ready to go ASAP to be ready to register in October when that date is made available. We, also, need our number going to the event so we can work on Transportation and housing. It is a fun event filled with worship, a service project event, bible study, fun, and a chance to

meet fellow NALC youth from around the world (there are a lot of NALC youth from Canada and other countries). There is a ratio of one sponsor per 7 youth going so we will need an additional adult sponsor or maybe two depending on our numbers.

CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING ST. PAUL LUTHERAN CHURCH August 12, 2025 @ 6 PM

- 1. CALL TO ORDER- The meeting of the Church Council of St. Paul Lutheran Church was called to order by Boyd Weise, President. Council members present for the meeting were Boyd Weise, Calvin Bruns, Wade Bolting, Laurey Garcia, Jay Heil, Larry Gohmert, Pam Hoefling, Jill Turner, Ashleigh Peyton, Susan Franke, and Pastor Tim Muehlbrad. Terry Carmichael was also in attendance.
- 2. **DEVOTION-** Larry Gohmert opened the meeting with prayer.
- 3. **MINUTES-** Pam Hoefling made a motion to accept the July 8, 2025, minutes as presented. Jay Heil seconded the motion. The motion carried.
- 4. REPORTS-

- a. **Treasurer/Stewardship-** Calvin Bruns provided a written report.
- b. Parish Education- Jill Turner reported:
 - 1. Vacation Bible school was July 21st through 25th. Both the Presbyterian and Methodist Churches participated. We averaged 74 kids: 54 big kids and 20 in the nursery. The Bible School offering was \$772 and was donated to the Kerrville flood victims.
 - 2. The new curriculum for Sunday School is in. Terry is working on getting a color printer for the basement, so the lessons can be printed out. The new curriculum will start on September 7th.
 - 3. Rally Day will be August 17th.
 - 4. The last day of summer Sunday School Classes will be August 24th.
 - No Sunday School Class on August 31st for Labor Day weekend.
- c. Youth Committee Report- Laurey Garcia reported:
 - 1. The annual swim party at the Cuero pool and splash pad had approximately 40 people in attendance, 26 of whom were children. Adyn Garcia did the prayer before our meal. The kids had a blast swimming and running around on the splash pad.
 - 2. The Back 2 School Bash was Wednesday, August 6th, from 6:30-8:30 PM at the park. This was the first time FFF has been able to participate in the B2S Bash. Aydn Garcia, Molly, Abigail, and Baily Gaus handed out cotton candy for FFF. Mrs. Gaus and I handed out pencil bags (Evangelism/Outreach) and popcorn for St. Paul as Pastor, Terry, and Wade Bolting were attending the NALC Lutheran Week in Pittsburgh.
 - 3. Our next committee meeting will be on Tuesday, August 26, 2025, at 6 PM.
- d. DCE- Terry Carmichael reported:

- 1. Besides the normal duties (Childcare Chapels, Sunday School, and other duties), the following were accomplished:
- 2. Performed with PT & Friends on 7/27.
- 3. Attended Camp Lone Star in La Grange, TX from 7/13-7/18 with Ashleigh Peyton and a total number of 14 campers (2 boys and 12 girls). The campers will share some of their experiences at the 8/16 church service and then during Rally Day Worship on 8/17.
- 4. Have been preparing the summer Sunday School Curriculum, music choices, schedule, and have been copying all the lessons for all the Sundays in the summer.
- 5. Have been providing teachers who have signed up to lead the summer Sunday School sessions with materials and supplies.
- 6. Have been teaching several summer classes on Sundays when there were no teachers signed up to teach the classes.
- 7. Met with Jill Turner, the preschool teachers, and elementary school Sunday School teachers on some of the best curriculum choices for Sunday School. After reviewing three choices, they agreed they preferred the SOLA (LCMC Publishing House) Curriculum. The preschool will have books for the teachers, and the elementary school curriculum, called SEED, will be an online/downloadable curriculum. These will need to be downloaded.
- 8. Assisted with Vacation Bible School from July 21st-25th by leading the openings and closings with Sadie Schustereit and assisting Pastor and the music team with the music center.
- 9. Have been preparing for Rally Day on 8/17.
- 10. Attended the NALC Lutheran Week activities from August 4th-8th in Pittsburgh, PA. It was an uplifting event, and the weather was wonderful (highs in the

mid-70s and lows dipping into the 50s one morning).

 - 1. Since our last meeting, I have mailed out two postcards to visitors to our church.

\$12,147.20. If you would like to make a donation to this project, please label your offering "AC/PLUMBING/FLOOR". Any help is greatly appreciated!


Guitar Lessons
